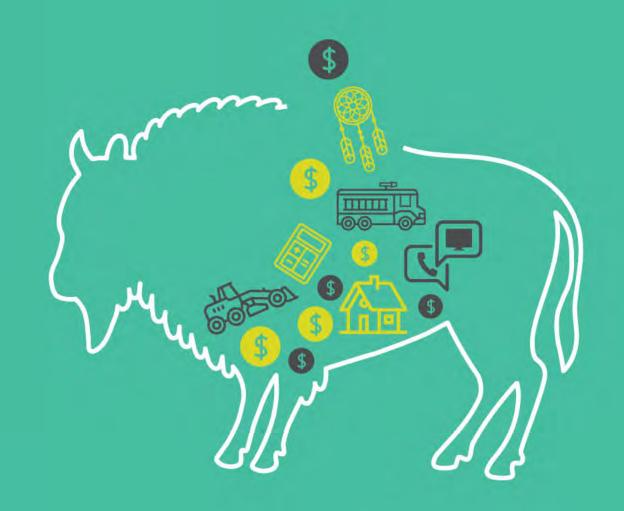

Description:	As a result of the 2016 wildfire, dozer guards were created around numerous communities in the RMWB. As a result we have inherited approximately 182 hectares of greenspace. Following Fire Smart principles, these areas will be rehabilitated and maintained as an open grass area 30m out from back of private property. Beyond the 30m, the impacted areas will be rehabilitated and reforested. Trails will also be connected to tie in locations with this capital request. This project is coordinated with recovery efforts.						
Major Outcomes:	If maintained properly, will reduce fire risk to the community while acting as a barrier against heat transfer, and RES can access these areas to fight a fire.
