Moving forward with the intent to focus entirely on competitions, it became necessary to improve the training standards and seek specialized instruction for technique and choreography. Unfortunately, we do not have access to this level of instruction in the RMWB and it would be cost prohibitive to send our dancers away for this training. Therefore, the MI Dance Competitive Team Association acquired the support of Team Canada Technical Director and Instructor, Paul Otterbein, to travel to Fort McMurray throughout the season to train our dancers on a monthly basis. Although this is cheaper than sending our dancers away, the costs associated still create a burden on the organization. However, receiving this level of training will allow our dancers to step up to a much higher level of competition and will lead toward the potential of meeting higher qualifying standards associated with regional, national and international competition. Without this stepping stone, the dancers would have plateaued and not have the chance to realize these possibilities. Adding this piece to their training has allowed the dancers entry to 5 high level competitions that were only granted because of referrals from Mr. Otterbein based on his calibre and credentials! The program includes participation in those 5 competitions with Mr. Otterbein continuing his training and providing corrections during and between each.

To this point, Hip Hop training has fallen under the umbrella of The Mac Island Dance Academy and provided by the general instructors that they employ. However, the instructors have not been hip hop specialists and so, as mentioned before, our dancers' skills began to plateau. 

This investment of the municipality to this Association will have incredible returns as I have seen the value of their investment in the Team increase significantly every year.

Moving forward with the intent to focus entirely on competitions, it became necessary to improve the training standards and seek specialized instruction for technique and choreography. Unfortunately, we do not have access to this level of instruction in the RMWB and it would be cost prohibitive to send our dancers away for this training. Therefore, the MI Dance Competitive Team Association acquired the support of Team Canada Technical Director and Instructor, Paul Otterbein, to travel to Fort McMurray throughout the season to train our dancers on a monthly basis. Although this is cheaper than sending our dancers away, the costs associated still create a burden on the organization. However, receiving this level of training will allow our dancers to step up to a much higher level of competition and will lead toward the potential of meeting higher qualifying standards associated with regional, national and international competition. Without this stepping stone, the dancers would have plateaued and not have the chance to realize these possibilities. Adding this piece to their training has allowed the dancers entry to 5 high level competitions that were only granted because of referrals from Mr. Otterbein based on his calibre and credentials! The program includes participation in those 5 competitions with Mr. Otterbein continuing his training and providing corrections during and between each.
