Subject:	Cross Country Mountain Bike Park								
Objective:	To provide Council a follow-up as requested on November 15, 2013, regarding the development of a bike park.								
Summary of Issue:	During budget deliberations on November 15, 2013, Council requested that Administration provide additional information about the development of a bike park. Currently, the region does not have a cross country mountain bike park. This was identified in the 2004 Parks and Recreation Master Plan as a high priority; and is a required venue for the 2015 Western Canada Summer Games. Moreover, on November 7, 2013, 100 people were consulted at a community engagement session regarding the preferred location for the development of a bike park. The Silin Forest Road (Ross Hennigar Park) was identified as the preferred site.

SUMMARY

- In previous parks/recreation master plans, a bike park was identified as a high priority
- Presently, there is no suitable venue for the cross country mountain biking course as required by the 2015 Western Canada Summer Games
- \$2 million has been designated for the bike park in the 2014 budget
- There are many bike enthusiasts in the region to sustain such a venue, including the Wood Buffalo Cycling Club



SITE SELECTION

- Seven (7) potential locations were considered for a bike park; however, a comparative site analysis narrowed it to the five (5) most suitable locations to be presented to the community for consideration:
 - North Parsons Creek
 - Silin Forest Road
 - Lower Wolverine Drive
 - Real Martin Drive
 - Abrams Land

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

November 7, 2013

Over 100 people were consulted regarding a preferred location for the development of a bike park.

- Four (4) optional sites were presented to the community:
 - North Parsons Creek
 - Lower Wolverine Drive
 - Silin Forest Road
 - Real Martin Drive
- 78% of those who responded chose Silin Forest Road area as the preferred location.

February 27, 2014

All four optional sites, with the addition of the Abrams Land site, were presented to the community for a total of five (5) potential sites for the bike park.

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

- In order to have the cross country mountain bike park ready for the 2015 Western Summer Games, construction must begin in Spring 2014.
- The Alberta Bicycle Association has requested that the cross country mountain bike park be in place by Summer 2014 to allow sufficient bedding prior to the Western Summer Games in 2015.
