








Stores & Fleet Inventory Management






Total Number of Solicitations – June 1, 2014 to December 1, 2015 Summary





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Treaty Thresholds Continued

AIT Thresholds (MASH)	New West Partnership Trade Agreement
\$100,000 or greater (goods)	\$75,000 or greater (goods)
\$100,000 or greater (services)	\$75,000 or greater (services)
\$250,000 or greater (construction)	\$200,000 or greater (construction)

Above these limits, all bids posted publically

Further Thresholds & APC

Construction	Goods & Services
< \$200 K – 3 Written Quotes	<pre>< \$75,000 (Procurement Card, >\$1 to <10K: Customer to get 1 – 3 quotes, >\$10 K to <\$75K Customer to get 3 written quotes)</pre>
> \$200 K – Posted Publically	> \$75,000 or greater posted publically

Non-Competitive Process

RMWB is compliant with AIT relative to circumstances for Sole Source or Exclusions



Exclusion examples:

- Requirement for items with patents
- Working with previously tendered contract items
- Emergencies
- Contract available through Provincial tendering practices

Notice of Intent (NOI) Process

RMWB believes there is only one source of supply Vendors can "raise their hand" to demand RFP issued Vendors deemed qualified are then included in a Competitive Bid process

Vendor Self Registry Database

We have launched in Aug. 2015, a key registry tool:

- Vendors will self-register into our database
- The database will be used for below threshold procurements
- The database will not create a preferred vendor list
- The database will not imply an offer of work from the RMWB
- The database will collect information to broaden the vendor base in our quoting requests

Social Procurement Framework

On January 26, 2016, SCM requested approval from Council to develop a Social Procurement Framework.

- A social procurement framework would drive significant benefit to the local business community.
- The Municipality would not be in violation of trade agreement legislation with the implementation of a social procurement framework.

Council approved the request unanimously, and development is currently underway.

What is a Social Procurement Framework?

-Social procurement leverages public dollars to achieve desirable and targeted social impact.

-The social procurement framework aligns procurement with the community values and strategic priorities.

-Social procurement balances the needs of people, planet and profit.

-The framework imposes a responsibility for the region's buyers to explore opportunities to achieve positive social outcomes and community benefits.

Social Procurement Framework

RMWB has awarded our first Social Procurement Contract.

- This Social RFQ for an urban snow clearing contract, was developed in partnership with the Centre of Hope. It will reward vendors who are willing to create work opportunities for recently housed, formerly homeless people.
- Centre of Hope has assigned the personnel management piece to Choices.
- The contract was split into three zones, and was subsequently awarded to two contractors.
