4.1. Voices of Albertans with Disabilities - Margot Brunner

Margot Brunner and Sam Mason, Accessibility Coordinators, Voices of Albertans with Disabilities, provided an overview of their organization and gave insight on the support and resource's they provide on accessibility for seniors and how to build age friendly environments.

5.2. Information Updates

Carolyn Evancio, and Luana Bussieres, will meet with a representative from the Transportation division of the Public Works Department regarding transportation for seniors to access the COVID-19 vaccine once it becomes available

Carol Theberge provided updates on the Willow Square Long-Term Care facility, noting the move of patients from the Northern Lights Regional Hospital to Willow Square is anticipated to happen at the end of May 2021. In addition, it was noted that transportation for residents of Willow Square has been procured, to provide residents with access to the COVID-19 vaccine when it is rolled out.

Henry Hunter reported that wellness calls are being made to residents living in Wood Buffalo Housing. It was also noted that residents of Fort Chipewyan received the COVID-19 vaccination due being a remote community with no access to medical staff.

Willow Square Continuing Care Centre



Overview

- Alberta Health Services (AHS) was granted possession of Willow Square in January 2021, and immediately began work on the commissioning phase of the project.
- The facility is built on 70% of the Willow Square site and the remaining 30% will be used for future developments as needed.
- Willow Square will provide residents in the Fort McMurray region a modern continuing care centre that will meet their present and changing residential and medical needs.
- We expect to begin welcoming residents in mid-2021.

Bed Capacity

- ∨ Capacity for 142 Beds
- ∨ 108 beds available on opening day
- 36 spaces shelled for future development.
 - Ø 34 long term care beds + 2 respite beds
 - Ø 34 supportive living beds + 2 palliative care beds
 - Ø 36 memory care beds

Service Models

Long Term Care

- complex unpredictable medical needs
- requiring 24-hour on site Registered Nurse assessment and/or treatment
- Supported by LPN and HCA staff

Supportive Living (DSL4)

- 24-hour on-site scheduled and unscheduled professional and personal care and support
- LPN and HCA staff
- RN support on call

Service Models

Memory Care (DSL4D)

- a secured therapeutic environment.
- provides 24-hour on site professional and personal care / support provided by LPN and HCA
- RN support on call
- Case management as needed by RN

Willow Square: Commissioning

The commissioning phase is crucial to ensuring the building and medical systems, and our healthcare teams are all fully prepared to provide safe and quality care to our patients prior to opening the facility.

Commissioning work includes:

- Final cleaning of the entire building,
- Installation of furniture and equipment.
- Training staff on new medical equipment and systems






