This process would include engagement with all regional Indigenous communities.

HISTORY OF SITE


Nistawoyou 'where three rivers meet':

- First inhabitants with a strong spiritual connection to these traditional lands
- Waterways, shorelines and lands have been central to the identities, lives, and cultural continuity of Indigenous peoples as long as their ancestors have resided in the area
- Provided subsistence, economic needs, a meeting place, spiritual and cultural well-being and mobility

MOCCASIN FLATS

History and Reconciliation:

- Métis families were evicted from the land in the 1970 to early 1980's
- Métis families and the community have suffered intergenerational affects of the eviction and disconnection from the land






OPTION 2 - SNYE LANDING




OPTION 2 - SNYE LANDING


