Four organizations have been recommended for the 2020 Community Capital Grant funding, for a total of \$8.3M.

**Process:**

- Each of the seven applicants will deliver a presentation.
- Following each presentation, Council will consider the request and Administrative Recommendation, and will then make a resolution on the grant amount to be approved before proceeding to the next Applicant presentation.

**Summary:**

There are seven applicants for the 2020 Community Capital Grant (Attachments 4.1 - 4.7) requesting over \$37.6M. Four organizations have been recommended for funding, for a total of \$8.3M.

**Background:**

On October 8, 2019, Council approved amendments to the Community Investment Program (CIP) Policy FIN-220. These amendments included parameters for the Community Capital Grant program. Prior to the 2020 budget season, there were only intermittent requests for capital that were allocated to non-profit organizations to build or upgrade their own facilities. Examples of approved Community Capital Grant requests include the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 165 (2014 and 2019), Fort McMurray Heritage Society (2011, 2013 and amendments in 2015), Rotary Club of Fort McMurray (for RotaryLinks Golf Course, 2016), and Northern Lights Health Foundation (2019).

**Budget/Financial Implications:**

The Administrative Recommendation is that four applicants/projects receive Community Capital Grants, totaling \$8,268,100.

**Rationale for Recommendation:**

The Administrative Recommendation is in alignment with the Community Investment Policy FIN-220.
