### **Development Vision for Dunvegan Gardens**

To retain the agricultural/horticultural related focus of the site, while adding related activities and business opportunities that respond to new trends in the greenhouse and agri-tainment industry such as:

- expansion of outdoor events incorporating patios, event lawns and gardens to host gatherings / events;
- local food and beverage processing, packaging and sales;
- petting zoos and animal interaction venue;
- food concessions;
- country store and market;
- farm life activities and events.
- The agrarian character of the area will be preserved and serve as the basis of future development.
- ❖ As the site evolves over time, new structures may be developed, re-purposed and repositioned. With this it is recognized that development parameters and considerations need to be incorporated.
- ❖ Development parameters and considerations are outlined in the planning documents that were submitted (ASP Amendment & Direct Control Land Use Bylaw Amendment).

## **Public Open House February 27th**

- Attendance: 21 visitors signed-in (2 RMWB Planners in attendance)
- Presentation boards were on display to show intent and the process of application.

  - Would be very disappointing to lose an important local business.
