Cannabis Legalization in the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo

July 9, 2018

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Considerations

- The Federal Government has announced that recreational Cannabis will be legal in Canada on October 17, 2018
- Senate has already approved Bill C-45
- Alberta Cannabis Framework and Cannabis Act
- Indigenous communities
- Alignment with federal, provincial laws, rules and guidelines
- Recommendations to Council will balance community engagement results with research and best practices

Goals & Timelines

- Project launch: Fall, 2017 (Provincial roundtable)
- Engagement started in February, 2018 in alignment with Provincial regulations
- Extensive community engagement sessions, resident survey, stakeholder meetings
- Public Engagement was completed in May, 2018
- Proposed Bylaws were developed and presented to Council in June, 2018
- First reading: June 12, 2018
- Public hearing: July 9, 2018

Federal Legislation

- Legalization of cannabis in October, 2018
- Minimum age of **18** to consume and possess
- Possession: up to 30 grams per adult
- Does not include edible cannabis or cannabis cafés
- Includes up to four cannabis plants per household

Provincial Legislation

- **Production/distribution** facilities regulated by Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC)
- Must be 18 years of age to consume, possess and/or purchase
- Cannabis and accessories-only retail stores
- Minimum **100 meters from schools**, and Provincial health care facilities
- Online sales managed by AGLC
- **Public consumption** up to municipalities

Municipal Legislation

- Land Use Bylaw
 - Separation Distance and Zoning for Cannabis Retail Stores
 - Separation Distance and Zoning for Cannabis Production Facilities
 - Restrictions for growing four Cannabis plants per household
- Smoke Free Bylaw
 - Public consumption: Like tobacco or alcohol?
- Business Licensing Bylaw
- Economic Development

Public Engagement: Overview

- Visits to all rural communities along with five engagement sessions for Urban Service Area (13 total sessions)
- Over 2,700 survey responses
- Over 1,000 direct interactions with residents
- Stakeholder meetings, correspondence and discussions

Public Engagement: Overview

- 57% concerned about cannabis use where youth will gather (33% not concerned, 10% other)
- 79% want minimum distances to extend beyond schools, hospitals to other public spaces
- **Public consumption:** 38% combination, 29% like alcohol, 28% like tobacco, 5% other
- 40% think it should be banned in public
- 66% think it will be positive for the economy (18% disagree, 16% other)
- One common theme: **Protect youth as much as possible**

Expected Business Impact

- The Planning and Development department receives 2-3 inquiries per day about Cannabis retail stores
- AGLC has received about twelve applications for Cannabis retail stores in Fort McMurray
- Fort McMurray First Nation 468 announced its plans for a production facility

Brief of LUB - Definitions

Cannabis Retail Store

- Cannabis Retail Store: A development that is used exclusively for retail sales of Cannabis and products that contain Cannabis in any form or proportion
- **Discretionary Use:** Municipal Planning Commission (allows a development officer to consider an application on its merit and the decision is advertised in newspaper for anyone to appeal)
- Added layer of community input

Brief of LUB: Definitions

Cannabis Production and Distribution Facility: A development that is principally used for one or more of the following uses:

- Growth, cultivation and production of Cannabis
- Processing, testing, manufacturing and assembling of Cannabis and any products/medicines that contain Cannabis in any form or proportion
- Storage, shipping/delivering and distribution of Cannabis and/or products containing Cannabis in any form or proportion

Brief of LUB: Definitions (continued)

- **Discretionary Use:** Municipal Planning Commission (allows a development officer to consider an application on its merit and the decision is advertised in the newspaper for anyone to appeal)
- Added layer of community input

Separation Distances


- 1. Balanced approach for development opportunities and restrictions
- 2. Maps with 50 meters, 100 meters, 150 meters, 200 meters and 300 meters separation distances around schools, day cares, health facilities, alcohol/drug rehabilitation centres and other public spaces were created to analyze locations


Separation Distances

Retail Stores Production Facilities 150 meters from schools, hospitals, 300 meters from alcohol/drug rehabilitation centres and day schools, health cares in the Urban Area facilities, and 100 meters from schools and playgrounds alcohol/drug rehabilitation centres in Hamlets Not immediately adjacent/abutting 300 meters from **Residential Area**

- Residential Areas but on the main floor of mixed use buildings
- The Development officer will have the authority to vary separation distances up to 10%

Separation Distance: 150 Meters

Cannabis Retail Store Legislation in BC

- 1. City of Victoria
 - 200 meters from schools
 - 400 meters from another Cannabis store
- 2. City of Vancouver
 - 300 meters from schools and community centers
 - 300 meters from another Cannabis store

Restrictions: Conditions of Permit

- No consumption inside store/facility
- No outdoor storage in facilities
- Complaints related to odour (smell from fresh and dried cannabis, cannabis plants and products containing cannabis) must be dealt with within 48 hours

Restrictions: Growing Plants

- In Single Family Housing, (including single detached, semi detached and row houses) 4 plants can be grown in:
 - House
 - Accessory Structure
 - Backyard
- In Multi-Family Housing such as apartments and condominiums, up to 4 plants can be grown within the private unit
- Growing Cannabis plants on Common Property (including balconies or exclusive use areas) will not be allowed

Restrictions: Public Consumption

• Consuming Cannabis in any form (including smoking and vaping) in public places will not be allowed
