Bison's Hip Hop is a training program that the Mi Competitive Team Dancers are attending one weekend per month for a 6 month period. The program instructor travels to RMWB to bring the program to the dancers so that the dancers do not have to travel outside of our region. It is a program designed to enhance hip hop skills at a highly competitive level and create choreography that will garner success at this level. We were fortunate to secure the services of National Team Coach, Mr. Paul Otterbein.

Mr. Otterbein has trained several of our individual dancers for international competition over the last few years and saw such talent in our region, that he agreed to assist our team as a whole! Last year, under his guidance, one of our dance teams became the Alberta Representative earning an invitation to the Hip Hop International Competition that was held in Montreal, PQ. Without having this program running in the RMWB, our dancers would never realize these goals and opportunities. Our dance program has expanded from 4 to 5 teams for this season and we have high hopes for even more dancers to experience this type of success.

Recently, 2 of our graduate hip hop dancers have been accepted to professional teacher training programs in Vancouver with the hopes of one day being able to support or supplement this type of training within the RMWB. Four other advanced or graduate hip hop dancers are currently gaining teaching experience within the MI Dance Academy as instructors for their recreational hip hop programs. Therefore, it is easy to see the far-reaching benefit this program has to our community.

Describe how these short-term programs or activities are beyond the applicants' regular on-going training or instruction.

Outside of this once a month program that runs from September to February, and depending on the level of our dancers, they are training, as a team, in 7 other genres for 5 to 12 1/4 hours per week from September to June. Individually, they also train for solos, duets, trios or small select groups and are also required to do select summer training.

On the weeks that we have the Bison's Hip Hop program, their training increases from 1 to 4 hours extra, again, depending on the level. Between the monthly hip hop programs, teams must find their own extra time, to practice and maintain their hip hop skills as well as rehearse choreography as a group.

This level of hip hop instruction and choreography is not available within the RMWB at our studio or any other. The MI Dance Academy does not provide hip hop training to our competitive dancers as they do not have access to an instructor or choreographer at this level. It is therefore up to the parent association to source out a professional who is capable of this task.

I am writing this reference letter on behalf of the MacDonald Island Competitive Team Association, as their tenacity and commitment to providing opportunity for dancers in the community is worthy of a Legacy Games Grant. As a lead dance instructor at MacDonald Island Dance Academy, I have been working closely with the Team and the Association for years. In the past five seasons, the Association has continued to support dancers in ways that are unparalleled. Most recently, as part of their mandate, the Association has been allocating funds to provide dancers with opportunities to work with world-class choreographers and teachers locally.

In the past years, the Team has travelled to Edmonton to participate in workshops in addition to their competitions. This has been a truly beneficial experience for the dancers in that they have had a chance to work with many talented instructors and choreographers. This year the team had to reevaluate these trips, as it was becoming increasingly hard for team members to finance an additional weekend in Edmonton. With the help of the Association, the dancers are now getting to work with the world-class choreographers in Fort McMurray. A plan has been put into motion, in which choreographers will be brought into Fort McMurray, and the workshops will be held here. Since September, Lory Lyon and Paul Otterbein have worked with the dancers, and there are more choreographers to come in the coming year. Furthermore, this initiative has led to additional workshops for both the community and other MacDonald Island Dance Academy dancers. This type of programming is rarely possible in remote communities of our size. However, the Association has worked to make something incredible happen.

It has been awe inspiring to see the fundraising initiatives the Competitive Team Association has organized to improve financial accessibility for all dancers. The byproduct of this fundraising support has been a visible improvement of the standard of dance throughout the Wood Buffalo region. Finances remain a hurdle for the Competitive Team Association because they continue to increase their budget to create new opportunities for dancers. The Association sets ambitious goals because they know that they are always one more bottle drive, or barbeque away from making the budget. This is why I feel the association is so worthy of a Wood Buffalo Legacy Grant. This investment of the municipality to this Association will have incredible returns as I have seen the value of their investment in the Team increase significantly every year.
