The Western Writers of America (WGA) 2020 International Conference is the premier gathering of western writers in North America. As the winner of the 2019 WGA Spur Award for Best Short Fiction, I will be returning to the 2020 conference with the opportunity to promote the Wood Buffalo region via my book, What You Take With You, a memoir of the Horse River Wildfire. It will broaden awareness of the wildfire and the resilience of our community.

The WGA event includes short-term developmental training and instruction opportunities in the form of clinics and workshops designed specifically for writers in the western region to develop skills in writing and editing to improve their literary work, as well as marketing, promotions and sales to promote the sharing and dissemination of literary work.

Also, during my previous attendance at the the 2019 event, I was able to work with organizers and attendees to arrange to bring a panel from that event to Wood Buffalo. The panel focuses on the literary arts and opportunities in particular for youth and other writers who wish to practice their art while remaining in the community, including Indigenous youth. It is my intention to make further connections at this event with writers, editors and publishers who are interested in coming to our region to work with our community to present these skills and awareness events and workshops.

In 2019 in partnership with the Writers Guild of Alberta (WGA), the Wood Buffalo Regional Library (WBRL) and Arts Council Wood Buffalo (ACWB), I personally hosted three free local writing workshops, including one in a rural region, with more than 60 local participants of all ages from a wide a range of cultures and backgrounds. In addition to advancing the literary arts this was designed to help people process thoughts and emotions from the wildfire experience. I expect to continue to work with WGA, WBRL and ACWB to offer workshops to promote and encourage development and growth in activities related to cultural activities, specifically the literary arts, in 2020. I expect to use information and connections from the WGA event in this pursuit.

Also, I am currently working with Indigenous partners on a writing conference for the Wood Buffalo region that will have major impact on the region. It is through my attendance at the 2019 Western Writers of American conference that I arranged for writers to come to Wood Buffalo to help upgrade local writing skills as well as share knowledge and experience with the community. I plan to continue this practice with connections made through attendance at the 2020 WGA conference. This relates to Truth and Reconciliation Call to Action # 43, to fully adopt and implement the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People (Article 11.1 and 13.1)

Article 11.1 states: Indigenous peoples have the right to practice and revitalize their cultural traditions and customs. This includes the right to maintain, protect and develop the past, present and future manifestations of their cultures, such as archaeological and historical sites, artefacts, designs, ceremonies, technologies and visual and performing arts and literature. Article 13.1 states: Indigenous peoples have the right to revitalize, use, develop and transmit to future generations their histories, languages, oral traditions, philosophies, writing systems and literatures, and to designate and retain their own names for communities, places and persons.

Describe how these short-term programs or activities are beyond the applicants' regular ongoing training or instruction.

There is no similar conference for western writers available in Canada. It is my intention to continue to bring information and skills learned at this event to share with the Wood Buffalo literary arts community.

My plan to disseminate this knowledge to the community involves:

- a) Continuing the free writing workshops I have offered in conjunction with the Arts Council Wood Buffalo and the Wood Buffalo Regional Library, using existing plans for marketing, registration, and facilities.
- b) Through a local literary festival being organized jointly with the Indigenous community, in keeping with Truth and Reconciliation Call to Action # 43, to fully adopt and implement the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People (Article 11.1 and 13.1)
- c) By publishing an article related to attendance at the conference.

My memoir of the Fort McMurray wildfire, What You Take With You: Wildfire, Family and the Road Home, was recently published by the University of Alberta Press. Weeks before the official release, the book had climbed to the top of Amazon.ca's Hot New Releases listings in the Natural Disasters Category. It has since made best seller lists in Calgary and Edmonton. My short crime fiction has appeared across Canada and the U.S. I won the 2019 Spur Award from the Western Writers of America for my story "Buck's Last Ride" in Kill As You Go, my 2018 short story collection. I have been short-listed three times for the Arthur Ellis Award, Canada's top mystery writing prize, and have co-edited two short crime fiction anthologies.
