

Incentives

 Intended to encourage investment that otherwise may not have occurred.

 Used to promote and stimulate specific development and improvements in an area.

Program Objectives

- 1. To **retain existing businesses**, while helping **attract new** types of business that will increase pedestrian presence on the streets;
- 2. To introduce new features and amenities that create **interest** and vibrancy, helping transform the downtown into a place where people want to spend time; and
- 3. To enhance the aesthetic qualities within the downtown.

Flood Impacted Properties

Not a Flood Recovery Program

- Not intended to replace personal insurance or DRP assistance
- Not intended to restore properties to pre-flood condition

Interior Improvement Grant Supports eligible projects:

- Reconfiguring space (subdividing or combining)
- Accessibility upgrades
- Safety upgrades
- Electrical, Plumbing, HVAC upgrades
- Energy efficiency upgrades

The Grants

- 1. Façade Improvement Grant
- 2. Interior Improvement Grant
- 3. Patio Grant
- 4. Beautification Projects and Murals Grants













Grant Values

Grant	Maximum Grant Per Building (50/50 matching)
Façade Improvements Grant	\$100,000 (corner buildings) \$75,000 (mid-block buildings)
Interior Improvement Grant	\$50,000
Patio Grant	\$10,000
Beautification Projects and Murals Grant	\$5,000 (beautification) \$30,000 (murals)

All grants provided as a 50% matching reimbursement grant

Program Eligibility

Applicants

- Property owners
- Property owner representatives
- Tenants

Buildings

- Existing downtown buildings
- Commercial, institutional and mixed-use

General Guidelines

Highlights

- Funding is first-come, first-served
- Grants are not retroactive
- Projects must meet the Program Guidelines, design standards
- Only complete applications are accepted
- Applicants will sign an agreement with the Municipality
- Projects must be completed in a timely manner
- Expenses are reimbursed after project is complete
- Applicants are responsible for paying contractors

Highlights

- Eligibility
- Requirements
- How to apply
- Façades Must include 5+ design elements (of 8)
- Patios Must meet basic requirements for location, design and safety
