

HOWELL, R. G. *not used	Member of Council 1977-1980. Moved to Red Deer, AB
HUMENIUK	The Humeniuk family settled in Fort McMurray in the 1960's and was an early pioneer in local business with the first insurance and travel agency in the municipality. Edward Humeniuk was a chemical engineer at GCOS and was instrumental in developing a patent for bitumen extraction from tar sands. Nick Humeniuk, who was elected as executive of Fort McMurray's first Toastmasters Club, had improved many of GCOS' initiatives. The family has made significant contributions to local business and industry. A letter of support from Member of Parliament, Brian Jean, was added to the Humeniuk file in October 2014 and a statement made by Member of Parliament, David Yurdiga on November 24, 2020 was also added to the supporting information.
HUTCHINSON, James *not used	Member of Council 1953-1956. Resigned October 31, 1955.
INGLES, Johnny *not used	Owned & operated local sawmill in the area; resided in Fort Chipewyan after selling his sawmill. Passed away September 2004.
INGS, Doctor George *not used	A surgeon. Accepted a government appointment to the north (circa 1921). He practiced in Fort McMurray until 1933.
INSPECTOR JARVIS *Not used?	South Policing Facility - 1st Choice of Committee. Willing to consider the initials of Inspector Jarvis to the name as well. William Dummer Jarvis was one of nine commissioned officers named in 1873 to command the newly found North West Mounted Police (NWMP). On July 8, 1874, the NWMP left Fort Dufferin, Manitoba on the March West and on August 1, 1874 Inspector Jarvis and 'A' Division left the main group and began the 1,408 kilometre march northwest. After an 88 day journey, the division wintered at the Hudson's Bay Company's Fort Edmonton while Jarvis scouted for an appropriate location for a new NWMP fort.
ISBISTER, William D. *not used	Ministerial Appointment June 30, 1964. Minister removes Isibister from Board June 13, 1966 to assist in writing the new Municipal Government Act., He was a Government employee.
JONES, Fred *not used	Second Engineer, Alberta Salt Co. Ltd. Circa 1925.
JUBILEE Plaza *not used	Municipal Facility – A unique urban space for the region and includes both indoor and outdoor components.
KENNICOTT, Robert *not used	A pioneer in northern ornithology. He was an American who set off along to pursue his hobby in the MacKenzie Watershed and over several years, from 1859, revealed to the world much of the fascination of the natural history of Canada's northland.
KILLICK, Dr. David &	Currently the longest serving doctor in Fort McMurray. Been involved

KNIGHT, CHARLES ? A. "Chuck" Recreation Centre *not used	Popular Mayor of Fort McMurray for many years; Elected October 13, 1971. Re-elected as Mayor October 20, 1986 – 1989. Served on a number of committees in the community. Moved to Fort McMurray in 1957. Raised several children, one of which has worked for the Municipality for many years. MacDonald Island Recreational Facility named in his honor. Offers the public curling rinks, ice surfaces, squash courts, golfing and banquet facilities.	
KOLEWASKI, Michael *not used	Elected to Council 1962-1965. Minister dissolves Council June 1964.	
KUSHNER, Sam *not used	Pioneer businessman. Member of Fort McMurray's Board of Trade in 1914. Opened fur trading and general merchandise store in 1914 called Kushners General Merchant and Fur Trade Store. Sold store in 1936 and renamed Hanson's Store, which was eventually sold and renamed again to Haxton's. Sam moved to Edmonton in 1942 and passed away in 1947. Sam was well known for his easy going style and respect for aboriginal people.	
KUTTNICK, ERIC *not used	Arrived in Fort McMurray in 1965 with his family to open up a Barber Shop in the Peter Pond Hotel. Owned and operated the barber shop for 27 years and was known as "Eric the Barber". Eric is currently (circa 2003) retired and residing in Fort McMurray.	
LABEAN, Gilbert *not used	No history available at time of publication.	
LAKES: *not used	Athabasca Calling Christina Churchill Cold Garson Gordon Great Slave Gregoire Heart Lac La Biche Lesser Slave	
LACROIX, Frank ? *not used (Arena)	Very active in promoting Minor Hockey in Fort McMurray. Passed away of cancer in 1997.	
LAKEWOOD □△ *not used	Devonian Properties (2001) proposed the name "Lakewood" for their subdivision because of the adjacent treed areas as well as to reflect the proximity to storm water management facilities and Conn Creek.	
LAMB, Bob ?	Named after the man who brought TV to Fort McMurray. Bob	

<p><i>*not used</i></p> <p>(BANDSTAND)</p>	<p>established ABC Cable in Fort McMurray in 1971. Through ABC, he contributed to the community for many projects, including donating \$100,000 to Keyano-Syncrude Training Centre. The bandstand is located in Borealis Park and provides music and multipurpose amphitheater for local entertainment.</p>
<p>LAMBERT, John</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p> <p>(Ball Field)</p>	<p>Was instrumental in building the MacDonald Island Golf Course. His wife Pat, is Executive Director of Keyano College Foundation. John passed away of cancer in the late 70's.</p>
<p>LAURENCE, Mr. —</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Engineer, Alberta Salt Co. Circa 1925. <i>(Lakewood Subdivision – October 14, 2003)</i></p>
<p>LEIRDAL</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Mr. and Mrs. Nils Leirdal settled in Waterways in 1939. Nils worked at the Salt Plant as an engineer until 1951, when the Salt Plant closed down. Nils then went to work at McInnes Products as a chief refrigeration mechanic. Nils also worked for Keyano College, and then he retired. Alice stayed at home as a homemaker. Nils and Alice Leirdal had two sons and one daughter.</p>
<p>LEISTER, Gus</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Member, first Board of Trade, 1921.</p>
<p>LEITH, J. R.</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Freighter in this area. Circa 1910 (or early 1900's).</p>
<p>LIETZ, Karl & Adrienne</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Karl and Adrienne lietz along with their daughter, Catherine Killick have been Fort McMurray premier hostesses, having had well over a thousand people to their home since their arrival in the 1965. Their impact on the newly arrived or longtime resident who have been warmly welcomed cannot be underestimated. People like the Lietzes and the Killicks make fort McMurray a friendlier place to visit and reside. In addition, because the Lietzes and Killicks live together, it has been easier for the Killick children to achieve their cross country achievements.</p>
<p>LENT, Margaret</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Elected to Council April 3, 1995. Re-elected October 19, 1998 – 2001.</p>
<p>LIONS PARK ♥</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Park located next to Heritage Park on Tolen Drive. The park includes playground equipment and picnic tables for a family outing.</p>
<p>LYNTON</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Small village 15 miles south of Waterways. Siding at the top of the hill out of the valley of the Clearwater. Due to the steepness of the hill, the yarding crew would take half the tonnage to Lynton and leave it on the siding. When the train to Lac La Biche left Waterways, it would leave with the other balance of the tonnage and at Lynton, stop and pick up the balance of the train cars and continue to Lac La Biche.</p>
<p>MacCAIG</p> <p><i>*not used</i></p>	<p>Named for MacCaig's Folly, Oban, Scotland. Suggested by Mrs. Trish MacCaig-Ross, last of the MacCaigs, who resides in Fort McMurray.</p>
<p><u>McDOUGALL</u>, Milton P.</p>	<p>Elected to Council 1959 – 1962. Resigned March 14, 1960.</p>
