As discussed in our phone conversation on Monday, March 21, 2022, I would like for you to please bring forth the following requests to the Community Identification Committee in regards to using our father's name.

Our number one priority as a family is to have our father's name to be used for naming a Fort McMurray sport related facility. However, because this type of development will likely take years, we are requesting in the interim a Fort McMurray street be named as long as it does not jeopardize taking his name out of the inventory for a sports facility/complex.

We understand that Fort McMurray already has a 'Campbell' street, therefore we are proposing using a different variation of the name such as RJC (for Robert James Campbell). We understand that you cannot rename the Fort Chipewyan Campbell Crescent, so we are simply requesting that his name/application be detached from this street as it is not relevant to where our father lived and contributed for 40 years. As mentioned in the original application, Robert James Campbell currently has 15 family members residing in Fort McMurray. Therefore, I am sure the committee can appreciate the desire to want his name/legacy to be recognized in the city of Fort McMurray.

I, Ali Myers, would be happy to present this proposal to the CIC at the next meeting on April 28, 2022.





MacEWAN, John Ω Walter Grant *not used	Born in Brandon Manitoba, August 1902. Professor of Animal Husbandry University of Saskatchewan and department head from 1928 to 1946. From 1946 to 1951 Dean of Agriculture University of Manitoba. Elected Alderman in Calgary 1953, 1955, 1957 and 1959; he was Mayor from 1963 to 1966. Elected MLA in 1955, became Alberta Liberal leader in 1958, defeated in 1959 election, resigned leadership in 1960. Lieutenant Governor of Alberta from 1966 to 1974 and made a Member of the Order of Canada in 1975. Between 1936 and 1987 he published 4 agricultural texts (2 collaborations) and 39 books on historical subjects. In 1965 the Grant MacEwan bridge opened providing access across the Athabasca River for the Great Canadian Oil Sands project.
MacFARLANE, Roderick *not used	Young Scot posted by the Hudson's Bay Company to Fort Simpson in 1853 "few men have led even in the hard regions of the north, a life of greater toil than Roderick MacFarlaneFor seventeen years (far down the MacKenzie River) he had remained cut off from the outer world; yet his mind never permitted itself to sink amidst the oppressive solitudes by which he was surrounded", quote by Captain W.F. Butler. MacFarlane became chief Factor at Fort Chipewyan. Circa 1872.
MACLEOD, Keith	Elected to Council 1974-1977. Resigned November 30, 1975.
*not used	
MARTIN, Edward *not used	A loner who lived in a tiny shack across the Slave River from Fort Smith. His epitaph on a column erected in his memory describes him as, "the best woodcutter of the northa silent and lone man who took pride in his work and built an honest pile". Column stands where the 60 <sup>th</sup> parallel crosses the Slave River south of Fort Smith.
MASON, W. Edward "Ted" *not used	Sat on Council following by-election February 23, 1977; after general election October 19, 1977, appointed Chairman (Mayor) of New Town of Fort McMurray - Town established 'City' status September 1, 1980. Elected Mayor City of Fort McMurray October 21, 1980, resigned January 1989.
MATHESON, Captain *not used	Captain who rebuilt the "Northland Echo" after she ran the Grand Rapids.
McCALLUM	Early doctor in Fort McMurray.
*not used	
MCCOLL, Douglas C *not used	May 28, 1973 Ministerial appointment. Resigned December 18, 1973. Government employee.
Mc CONNELL, Robert *not used	An explorer and geologist with considerable reputation. He set realistic sights on assessing oil sands in situ. He turned the attention of scientists and investors towards extracting the oil which existed within surface deposit. As a result, the Canadian government funded a specific project to help solve the oilsands mystery and the industrial growth in Fort McMurray began.

William McMurray was a true son of the northwest and was born with Hudson's Bay Company blood running through his veins. Born March 4, 1824, one of two sons of Chief Trader Thomas McMurray. The father had been a partner in the North West Company when it amalgamated with the H.B.C. William McMurray joined H.B.C. early on and at 18 was serving in the Great Slave Lake area. In 1853, at the age of 28, he became Chief Trader while he was serving at Fort Resolution. In 186y, he was transferred from Fort Alexander to Fort Chipewyan. He encouraged John Moberly to establish a Hudson's Bay at "the forks" junction of the Athabasca and Clearwater Rivers. From this site, the fort could oversee and regulate the traffic going to and from Portage La Loche. John Moberly, in return, named the post Fort McMurray. William eventually became inspecting Chief Factor in Winnipeg but never really assumed his duties as such as he died within 3 months, on March 7, 1877, shortly after his 53 <sup>rd</sup> birthday.
