COUNSELLOR CONFLICT

There are several members of Council who we believe are in a pecuniary conflict of interest related to these Applications. We made mention of this when we submitted our documentation a few days ago, but being ignorant of the process, did not realize that there was only really one way that we could communicate this information to you once the 1st Reading had taken place. We now understand that we have only one means of bring this forward to you. We were trying to make this less embarrassing for all concerned and did not realize that that was possible.

The first concern relates to Mayor Donald Scott.

Over the past several years, Brad Friesen has talked to various Draper Residents and vacant property owners about starting an association with the goal of changing the zoning and Character of Draper to legalize his non-allowable commercial activities. People opposed to his activities have been invited to such meetings and have discussed the matter with other Residents.

This past year, Mr. Friesen organized and started the Draper Community Spirit Association with several other land owners, with the objective to:

"Build community spirit and positive relationships with Wood Buffalo residents. Promote tourism, advocate for community development, advocate for appropriate infrastructure and land use. Promote responsible and reasonable development. preserve the heritage and historical sites and promote responsible and recreational use. Educate the public about the historical significance of the Draper area. Raise funds to carry out the goals of the organization."

We see this as nothing more than a group trying to commercialize our community, change our zoning, contravene our Municipal Development Plan and make money in a Community that was mandated as quiet country living for its residents. The Dunvegan Garden applications are obviously part of this objective.

Mayor Scott, after he was elected in the Municipal election in 2017, chose to carry on operating his local Fort McMurray law practice. He is still a practicing member of the Law Society of Alberta (Exhibit 1) and is still the owner of the "Don Scott McMurray Law Office (Exhibit 2) and acts as a lawyer while doing his role as Mayor.

The Don Scott McMurray Law Office acted as legal counsel for the Draper Community Spirit Association, formed the Association and continues to act as the Association's registered office (Exhibit 3). Mr. Brad Friesen is a Director of this Association.

Accordingly, we believe that this creates a pecuniary conflict of interest as this Association pays this law office for its services and there exists a further conflict related to the duties of a lawyer to his client and we respectfully ask that he recuse himself from this matter.

This event took place after Mr. Friesen sent each candidate a letter on September 20, 2017, asking them to provide him with their position concerning these Applications.

A second concern of pecuniary conflict relates to Counsellor Krista Balsom.

We believe that this Counsellor is in a material conflict in relation to all matters related to Dunvegan Gardens. Ms. Balsom owns a local magazine called YMM Magazine, which is owned by her corporation, "Balsom Communications Inc.", with a registered office at Don Scott McMurray Law Office. She is the "Editor-in-Chief/Publisher" of the magazine (Exhibit 4).

The Magazine has regularly promoted Dunvegan Gardens over the years (Exhibit 5) and recently did an article in its Happy Holiday Guide 2017 Special Edition, published and circulated just before this past Christmas (Exhibit 6), after the election and the letter sent by Brad Friesen to candidates on September 30, 2017. In this edition, it contains on page 33 an advertisement of Dunvegan Gardens, advertising its "Winter Wonderland, discussed in our Submission in relation to Counsellor Peddle's promotions of the Christmas retail store. The magazine also has an article about Dunvegan Gardens on page 34.

Draper Residents also noticed that Krista Balsom posted a large election sign in Draper (Ward 3) during the last election, despite being a Ward 1 candidate. We can only assume that she was attempting to obtain the support of Dunvegan Gardens' customers who live in Ward 1.

On September 30, 2017, Brad Friesen sent each candidate the following email:

"Good Afternoon,

I am writing to you in regards to the rezoning of Dunvegan Gardens 128 Garden Lane property. As Fort McMurray is about to vote in a new mayor and council, we feel it is important we know all the candidates views on this topic.

Last winter we had over 15,000 signatures on a petition to keep the business here in Fort McMurray all signed by local residents. We're working on rezoning our property with the RMWB. With this in mind, we are going before council in October for this. We would like to know if you are in support of this application or not and please give us a reason for your answer. We would also appreciate your reply by Tuesday October 3, 2017 as we would like to share this with our social media followers since they are also curious to know who/ who doesn't support this.

Brad Friesen Dunvegan Gardens (AB) Ltd. VP of Operations, NCSO"

After receiving this letter from Brad Friesen on September 30, 2017, Krista Balsom posted the following online on October 2, 2017:



Counsellor Balsom published this information, two days after Dunvegan Gardens asked Counsellor candidates to provide their position concerning the legalization of its business in Draper. To our knowledge, Counsellor Balsom made no effort to determine what the issues

were in Draper from the Residents who oppose Dunvegan Gardens or who are affected by its illegal activities all these years that she has supported the business in her magazine.

Accordingly, we believe that Counsellor Balsom is in a pecuniary conflict of interest in that she profits from the advertising of Dunvegan Gardens in her magazine that is at risk in these applications and has an established bias and we therefore respectfully request her to recuse herself from this matter.

A BY-LAW GOVERNING THE PROCEDURE AND BUSINESS OF THE DRAPER COMMUNITY SPIRIT

ASSOCIATION ("THE SOCIETY")

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED as a By-Law of the Society as follows:

Section 1 - Interpretation

In all By-Laws of the Society, unless the context otherwise specifies or requires:

orporate Registry

- (a) "Act" means the Societies Act, R.S.A. 2000 Ch. S-14 as from time to time amended and every statute that may be substituted therefore, and, in the case of such substitution, any references in the By-Laws of the Society to the provisions of the Act shall be read as references to the substituted provisions in the new statute or statutes;
- (b) "Annual General Meeting" means the Annual General Meeting called pursuant to Section 7.01;
- (c) "Appoint" includes "elect" and vice versa;
- (d) "Board of Directors" Executive Committee or Board" shall mean the Board of Directors of the Society;
- (e) "By-Laws" means this By-Law and all other By-Laws of the Society from time to time in force and effect; and
- (f) "Member" or "Membership" means a member as defined in Section 2.01.
- (g) "Special Resolution" means:
 - i) A resolution passed:
 - a) at a special or general meeting of the Society of which not less than 21 days' notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution has been duly given, and
 - b) by vote of not less than 75% of those members who, if entitled to do so, vote in person or by proxy,
 - ii) A resolution proposed and passed as a special resolution at a general or special meeting of which less than 21 days' notice has been given is, if all the members entitled to attend and vote at the general or special meeting so agree, or by a resolution consented to in writing by all the members who would have been entitled at a general or special meeting to vote on the resolution in person or by proxy.

1.02 Interpretation

Save as aforesaid, all terms contained in the By-Laws of the Society which are defined in the Act or regulations shall have the meaning given to such terms in the Act or regulations. Words

importing the singular number include the plural and the converse shall also apply. Words importing gender include the masculine, feminine, and neuter genders. Words importing a person include a body corporate.

1.03 Headings

The headings preceding the clauses of the By-Laws have been inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not be considered or taken into account to constrain the terms or provisions of the By-Laws, nor deemed in any way to qualify, modify or explain the effect of any such terms or provisions.

Section 2 - Membership

2.01 Membership

Any person being the full age of 18 years and owning land in Draper, within the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo, Alberta, and who supports the aims of the Society may become a Member by a favourable vote passed by a majority of the members at a regular meeting of the society, and upon payment of the Membership fee. Such voting shall be by ballot, unless the meeting by resolution otherwise decides. The interest of each Member is not transferable to another.

2.02 Membership Fees and Categories

Membership fees and categories of Membership in the Society shall be determined from time to time by the Members at a general meeting. The Board, in its absolute discretion, may waive the fees for any Member.

2.03 Withdrawal from Membership

Any Member wishing to withdraw from the Membership may do so upon giving notice in writing to the Society through its secretary.

2.04 Expulsion or Suspension of Member

If any member is in arrears for fees or assessments for any year, such member shall be automatically suspended at the expiration of six months from the end of such year and shall thereafter be entitled to no membership privileges or powers in the society until reinstated. Any member upon a majority vote of all members of the society in good standing may be expelled from membership for any cause which the society may deem reasonable.

Section 3 – Board of Directors

3.01 Duties of Board of Directors

- (a) The Board shall, subject to the bylaws or directions given it by majority vote at any meeting properly called and constituted, have full control and management of the affairs of the society.
- (b) To vote on any resolutions brought forward to the board either in person or by proxy
- (c) To attend all meetings including general, special and annual meetings

(d) To act in utmost good faith and promote the best interest of the Society when acting as a representative of the Society

3.02 Board Makeup

- (a) The Membership, by majority vote, will appoint all vacant positions of the Board from within its membership at the Annual General Meeting for a standard term as defined in section 3.03 of these by-laws
- (b) A person appointed or elected a director becomes a director if they were present at the meeting when being appointed or elected, and did not refuse the appointment. They may also become a director if they were not present at the meeting but consented in writing to act as director before the appointment or election, or within ten (10) days after the appointment or election, or if they acted as a director pursuant to the appointment or election
- (c) The Board will consist of seven (7) Directors, who will be elected from the membership;
- (d) The Board, by resolution, may appoint any director of the Board to sit, for a period of one year, as a member of the executive committee; and
- (e) The Executive committee is made up of the following:

Chair

Vice-Chair

Secretary

Treasurer

3.03 Term

The Directors elected by voting Membership shall serve as Directors for a term of one (1) year unless they are removed pursuant to this By-Law or have resigned. A Director may serve an unlimited number of terms.

3.04 Removal of Directors and Officers

- (a) The office of a Director or Officer shall be automatically vacated:
 - (i) If the Director or Officer resigns the office by delivering a written resignation to the Society;
 - (ii) On the death of a Director or Officer;
- (b) The Board may remove a Director or Officer:
 - If the Director or Officer is absent from more than three meetings without notice or excuse;

- (ii) If the Director or Officer engages in a course of conduct that could seriously harm, or harms, the organization's finances, operations, or reputation/credibility in the community
- (c) The membership can remove a Director or Officer
 - (i) If a motion to remove the Officer or Director is submitted to the Society and passed by a majority of the membership
 - (ii) If a motion is made at the Annual General Meeting, and is passed by a majority of the membership

3.05 Vacancies

The Board may, by a majority of votes, from time to time, appoint a person as a Director for the purpose of filling a vacancy on the Board created by the resignation or removal of a Director. Such appointment shall continue until the next Annual Meeting and shall not be considered part of the said Director's official term for the purposes of Section 3.02.

3.06 Remuneration and Expenses

The Directors and Officers shall serve without remuneration and shall not directly or indirectly receive any profit from the position as a director or officer. A Director or Officer may be paid reasonable expenses incurred by the Director or Officer in the performance of their duties. Any Director or Officer who is engaged in or is a member of a firm engaged in any business or profession shall not be retained by the Society to provide services to the Society without the approval by resolution of two-thirds (2/3) or the Directors present at a properly constituted Board meeting. The said resolution shall specify the term and conditions of the engagement. Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to preclude any employee of the Society from serving the Society as an officer and receiving compensation for their employment with the Society.

3.07 No Liability

No Director or officer of the Society is liable for the acts, receipts, neglects or defaults, or for any loss or expense happening to the Society through the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired by order of the Board for or on behalf of the Society, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the monies of the Society shall be invested or contributed, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy or insolvency or tortuous act of any person with whom any monies securities, or effects of the Society shall be deposited, or for any loss occasioned by an error of judgment or oversight on the Director's part, or for any other loss, damage or misfortune whatever which may happen in the execution of the duties of the Director's office or undertaking or in relation thereto, unless the same happened through the Director's own dishonesty or willful neglect.

3.08 Indemnity by the Society

Subject to such limitations as may be imposed by law, every Director and officer of the Society and the Director's heirs, executors, administrators, and other legal personal representatives shall be indemnified by the Society against, and the Board shall pay out of funds of the Society, any

liability and all costs, charges and expenses that such Director or officer shall sustain or incur in respect of any action, suit or proceedings that is proposed or commenced against the Director by reason of any act or thing done or permitted by the Director by reason of the execution of the Director's office or undertaking, if:

- (a) The Director acted honestly and in good faith with a view to the best interests of the Society;
- (b) In the case of a criminal or administrative action or proceeding that is enforced by a monetary penalty, the Director had reasonable grounds for believing that the conduct was lawful; and
- (c) The Director acted without dishonesty and without willful neglect.

3.09 Meetings of the Board of Directors

Meetings of the Board shall be held at such time and on such days as the Chair of the Society may, from time to time, determine.

3.10 Notice of Meetings

- (a) Notice of Meetings shall be by mail or electronic media to the Member's address as noted in the records of the Society. Postmark or dated electronic media shall be used to confirm delivery of the material. Meetings of the Board shall be called by providing ten (10) days' notice in writing mailed, or by providing three (3) days' notice given by electronic media prior to the meeting.
- (b) Meetings may be held without notice if a quorum of the Board is present, provided however, that any business transactions at such meeting shall be ratified at the next regularly called meeting of the Board; otherwise they shall be null and void.

3.11 Quorum

Four (4) of the Directors elected or appointed shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board.

3.12 Voting

(a) Questions arising at any meeting of the Board shall be decided by a majority of votes cast at that meeting. In the case of an equality of votes, the Chair of the meeting shall not have a second or casting vote and the question in such case shall be considered lost.

3.13 Rules of Procedure

The Board may establish by resolution rules to be followed at the meetings of the Board. Without limiting the foregoing, the Board may, by resolution, direct that votes be taken by secret ballot.

3.14 Resolution in Writing

A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors personally, or confirmed by email, facsimile or other similar method of communication from all Directors in accordance with the policies of the Society, shall be valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Board duly called and constituted.

3.15 Meeting by Telephone

Directors may participate in a meeting of the Board by means of telephone or other communication facilities that permit all persons participating in the meeting to hear each other, and, the Directors participating by those means are deemed to be present at the meeting.

3.16 Conflict of Interest

The Directors may establish, by resolution, policies designed to address real or perceived conflicts between the interests of the Society and the interests of the Directors, officers, Members and employees of the Society.

Section 4 – Duties and Responsibilities of the Executive Committee

4.01 Duties of the Chair

- (a) To sit on all committees of the society (ex officio)
- (b) To prepare the agenda, and, when present, preside at all meetings of the society and of the Board. In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall preside at any such meetings. In the absence of both, a chairperson may be elected at the meeting to preside.
- (c) To publicly represent the board in all written documentation and media responses
- (d) To vote on any resolution of the board only in the event of a tie
- (e) To prepare an annual report to the membership
- (f) To delegate any duties of the chair as required

4.02 Duties of the Vice Chair

(a) To assume the duties of the chair, should the chair forfeit, or delegate them.

4.03 Duties of the Secretary

- (a) To attend all meetings of the society and of the Board, and to keep accurate minutes of the same.
- (b) To have charge of the Seal of the society which whenever used shall be authenticated by the signature of the Secretary and the President, or, in the case of the death or inability of either to act, by the Vice President. In case of the absence of the Secretary, their duties shall be discharged by such officer as may be appointed by the Board.
- (c) To have charge of all documentation and correspondence of the Society and be under the direction of the President and the Board.
- (d) To be responsible for reviewing, and updating all documentation, as necessary, and ensuring all documents are safely stored and readily accessible

4.04. Duties of the Treasurer

- (a) To receive all monies paid to the Society and be responsible for the deposit of same in whatever Bank, Trust Company, Credit Union or Treasury Branch the Board my order.
- (b) To property account for the funds of the ociety and keep such books as may be directed.
- (c) To present a full detailed account of receipts and disbursements to the Board whenever requested
- (d) To prepare for submission to the Annual Meeting a statement duly audited of the financial position of the Society and submit a copy of same to the Secretary for the records of the Society.
- (e) The office of Secretary and Treasurer may be filled by one person if any annual meeting for the election of officers shall so decide.
- (f) keep an accurate record of all financial transactions of the society
- (g) . To adhere to, and administer any financial policy documents of the society
- (h) To work with any external book keeper, accountant, and auditors as required to conduct society business.

Section 5 - Execution of Instruments

5.01 Signing Authority

The Board may, from time to time, designate by resolution the manner in which the person or persons by whom any particular instrument or class of instruments may or shall be executed, and all instruments so executed shall be binding upon the Society without further authorization or formality. In the event that such a resolution is not passed, any and all documents, deeds, transfers, assignments, contracts, obligations, certificates and other instruments may be executed on behalf of the Society by any two officers or any two Directors or by one officer and one Director, together.

5.02 Cheques, Drafts and Notes

All cheques, drafts or orders for the payment of money and all notes, acceptances and bills of exchange shall be signed in such manner and by such Directors of the Society or other persons or any combination of the foregoing as the Board may, from time to time, designate by resolution.

Section 6 - Records, Fiscal Year, Annual Report

6.01 Books and Records

The Board shall see that all necessary books and records of the Society required by the By-Laws of the Society or by any applicable statute or law are regularly and properly kept and shall, at all reasonable times during regular business hours, be open to inspection by the Members. The treasurer/secretary is responsible for taking and keeping the minutes of the society meetings.

6.02 Fiscal Year

Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the fiscal year of the Society shall terminate on the 31st day of December in each year.

6.03 Annual Report

Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the Society shall prepare and, on or about one hundred and eighty (180) days after the end of each fiscal year, submit to the Membership an annual report, which shall include the financial statements and any other statements and reports that the Board may require.

Section 7 - Meetings

7.01 Annual General Meeting

- (a) The Society shall hold an Annual General Meeting. This meeting is the only general meeting required of the society. At the Annual General Meeting, the Membership shall elect all vacant or to term board positions, from the Membership.
- (b) The Annual General Meeting will take place on or before June 30th of each year.
- (c) Notice of the Annual General Meeting shall be made by mail or electronic media to each Members' address as noted in the records of the Society. Postmark or dated electronic media shall be used to confirm delivery of the material. Where a Members' address has changed it will be the responsibility of the Member to inform the Society of said change in a timely manner not to exceed 30 days from the date of change.
- (d) The membership shall receive notice of the Annual General Meeting and all Special Resolutions with no less than twenty-one (21) days of notice.
- (e) Twenty (20) per cent of voting Members in person or by duly executed Proxy, as recorded in the records of the Society, shall constitute a quorum for a meeting of its Membership.
- (f) Each voting Member shall have the right to vote at any meeting of Members of the Society. Votes may be made in person or by proxy.
- (g) The Membership may establish by resolution the rules of procedure to be followed at all meetings of the Membership. Without limiting the foregoing, the Membership may, by resolution, direct that votes be taken by secret ballot.
- (h) A proxy may appoint an individual to vote on behalf of the appointer or record a vote where a copy of the resolution is included in the meeting notice. The instrument appointing a proxy or recording a vote shall be in writing in any effectual form under the hand of the appointer or the appointer's attorney duly authorized in writing and need not be attested. No person who is not a Member may be appointed as a proxy.
- (i) A proxy is valid only at the meeting or for the resolution in respect of which it is given or any adjournment of that meeting or resolution. A proxy may be revoked, at any time, in writing under the hand of the appointer or the appointer's attorney.
- (j) The proxy shall be left with the chairperson or with such other person in such other place as may be specified in the notice of meeting or at the meeting with the chairperson thereof before the vote is taken. In default of such deposit, such proxy is not valid.

7.02 Special Meetings of the Society

Upon the written request setting forth the reasons for calling such meetings signed by at least five (5) Directors or at least one-third (1/3) of the Membership, the Chair shall call a special meeting of the Society. This meeting shall occur within thirty (30) days of the request.

7.03 Notice of Meetings

- (a) Notice of scheduled meetings of the board of directors shall be made available to the membership via electronic media. Formats of transmission may include, but are not limited to: Email, Website notices, and posts on social media.
- (b) Non board members, shall be excused for all in camera sections of board meetings.

Section 8 - Borrowing Powers

8.01 Powers of Society

For the purposes of carrying out its objects, the Society may borrow or raise or secure the payment of money in such manner as it thinks fit. In no case shall debentures be issued without the sanction of a special resolution, as defined in the Act, or the Society's By-laws.

Section 9 - Audit

9.01 Audit Annually

The books, accounts and records of the Society shall be audited each year by a duly qualified accountant or by two Members of the Society elected for that purpose at the Annual General Meeting. A complete and proper statement of the standing of the accounts for the previous year shall be submitted by such Auditor at the Annual Meeting of the Society.

Section 10 - Amendment to the By-Laws

10.01 Method of Amendment

These By-Laws may be amended, altered, added to or rescinded by special resolution of the Society. Such changes to the By-laws are not effective until such time as the changes have been accepted and registered by the Registrar under the Societies Act.

Section 11 - Distribution of Property upon Winding Up or Dissolution of the Society

11.01 Return to Grant Sponsors

All property in the hands of the Society upon winding up or dissolution of the Society that has been placed in its hands by a grant sponsor and has not been disbursed pursuant to the terms of the granting agreement between the Society and the Grant Sponsor shall be returned to the Grant Sponsor or otherwise dealt with in accordance with the agreements between the Society and the Grant Sponsor.

11.02 Casino Funds

Any funds remaining in the hands of the Society upon winding up or dissolution of the Society that originated from casino revenue which remain after the payment of all debts, liabilities and other obligations of the Society for which such funds can be used pursuant to the terms of the casino license, shall be delivered to a registered charitable organization determined by the Board and which is acceptable pursuant to the terms of the casino license.

11.03 Remaining Funds or Assets

Any remaining funds or assets in the hands of the Society, with the exception of casino funds per bylaw 11.02, and grants funds per bylaw 11.0, upon winding up or dissolution of the Society after the payment of all debts, liabilities and other obligations of the Society of any kind shall be delivered to a registered charitable organization determined by the Board.

Q When it comes to the holiday season in Fort McMurray, nobody does it like Dunvegan Gardens. Brad Friesen, VP of Operations, tells us more about how it all started, and what you can expect when you visit.



YMM: Take us back to when Dunvegan Gardens started supporting Christmas in Wood Buffalo. When did it all begin, and why?

Dunvegan Gardens' first Christmas for the residents goes as far back as about 1982 with the greenhouses in Grande Prairie and Peace River. We have been in the business of Garden Centres for more than 35 years. The trend within Garden Centres used to be Ma & Pap operations that were opened May to July, but if you then needed to try and find a job the other months always made things tough only wanting seasonal work then in March you started having to seed and plan for the next season.

Like everything throughout our world came progress and the competition in the world with Big Box stores. We had to change the product mix, hours of operation and rethink all that we were doing. When the box stores started flogging our products at cost or as loss leaders then we had to re-invent ourselves, and with that came the 12-month Garden Centre open year-round with full-time staff, greater than just the family, and an increase in product line.

So our supporting of Christmas in Wood Buffalo came in 2001 with our first Christmas in a small store on Gregoire Drive. We had it plenty full the first year, and to so many people's amazement, Christmas came to Fort McMurray grander than it was in the past. We have become the Christmas Store; from that first year and every year since we have had wonderful Christmas displays that start as early as the 15th of October. People want to shop for the tree and home before worrying about presents or the food that will be on the table during the Christmas season as we remember Bethlehem and the birth some 2000 years earlier.

We believe that Garden Centres and nurseries, farms and market gardens are the ones who have helped invest back into Christmas in communities around the world.

YMM: Tell us about the Christmas Village.

The Christmas Village was one of our ideas. We had all of this empty space, so my wife, Terri, suggested that we create trails and make it like a walk in the park. Together with her team, Terri has

created an experience like none other for the third year in a row. It's magical for kids, young families, and friends to walk through as we play a special Christmas soundtrack created by Terri.

Our Christmas Village gives people ideas for Christmas decorating, themes, and just a magical environment to shop in. In the past we've done a Winter Wonderland in the past, as well as Christmas in the City. This year we've combined the two and also added in the Elves Playground at the North Pole.

YMM: What makes Dunvegan Gardens a great place to buy your Christmas tree locally?

Dunvegan Gardens reinvests what it makes all back into this community. The owners live here; they do not send it to shareholders around the world, across the country or across the province. We are local to this community; we do not answer to people who tell us what have or sell, but to the people we serve.

Our trees have come from the same tree farm for the past 15 years. We have been selling Christmas trees for over 30 years; in that time, we have had four suppliers, one we no longer deal with as the true Charlie Brown trees are not sought after anymore as more people want the fuller tree: Grand Fir, Fraser Fir or Pine tree. My favourite has always been the Grand Fir for its needle texture in decorating, and the smell that it produces throughout the house. When we find a supplier who will stand behind their product and continue to give you a great product at a reasonable price we keep our loyalty with them for years. We also strive to look for closer suppliers to help reduce our carbon footprint on the environment.

YMM: Talk a bit about all of the amazing Christmas décor that you have.


The Christmas decor is ordered at shows in January. Only weeks after all of it is taken down, we are planning for the next year. We look forward to that time every year as in January we have a little rest before starting to plan the next season. We go to shows from Vancouver to Toronto to bring you some of the more unique things that can be found out there. We spend over a week browsing for what we will want, and then doing the purchasing throughout showrooms and trade shows.

YMM: What kind of Christmas gifts can be found at Dunvegan **Gardens?**

We have a little bit of everything...things for men, women, and children. You can find gifts for people when you're invited out to a friend's for a house warming. You can find things related back to the farm, things to do with travel and things for teachers. First Christmases for babies, as well as a full line of artificial and real Christmas trees, garlands, poinsettias and all the decorations.





In 2011, Dunvegan Gardens and KAOS 91.1 co-founded a Giant Easter Egg Hunt held at Dunvegan's Draper Road farm. Neither Dunvegan Gardens nor we could have imagined the extent of the crowds that would show up to search for the plastic eggs in the hay and the greenhouses. The Giant Easter Egg Hunt morphed into an annual event attracting more than 3,000 people every year. This year is our seventh annual hunt and we're expecting to have our most participants yet.



In preparation for the Easter egg hunt, more than 33,000 plastic eggs are stuffed with wrapped candy or notes that lead hunters to a bigger prize at the front of the store. Chocolate eggs and bunnies, bags of candy, and small toys are among the prizes. The most sought-after prize is a golden egg with a note inside which may entitle the participant to a new bike or 'Melissa and Doug' branded toys.

The planning for the Giant Easter Egg Hunt begins the day after the previous year's hunt and the excitement continues all year long. Busses are rented and scheduled, off site parking is arranged, portable washrooms are ordered, permits are applied for, community mascots are locked in, traffic directors are requested and the prizes are collected. The Annual Easter Egg Hunt is a huge undertaking but it is always worth it when we see the kids caught up in magic it creates.

KAOS 91.1 continues to partner in the event as part of our commitment to promoting healthy families and healthy communities. We get on board with advertising the event through commercials and our announcers talking about it in the lead-up. On the day of the event, we offer hot drinks, face painting and balloons. We also arrange for our staff and a host of volunteers to help manage the crowds of excited hunters. This year's hunt is on April 17 so if you tune your radio to 91.1 that day, in between the broadcast of some 'Real. Good. Music,', you'll hear live updates of each of the Easter egg hunts.

The Easter Bunny himself and owner of Dunvegan Gardens, Brad Friesen spoke with us about the event saying, "We delight in putting the Easter Egg Hunt on every year. It's such a great event for young and old and inclusive of all people. We love watching the joy and laughter it brings to the folks who come out. It's so heartwarming to see the children having fun and we're so thankful for the local businesses and neighbours who have partnered with us in helping to make a difference in the community for good. It's definitely a huge highlight on our calendar."

This year, ten Easter egg hunts are scheduled with the first one starting at 10:00.am. Buses run from off-site parking checkpoints every 20 minutes. A small fee is collected per child and adults are free. A mom of two, regular attendee and KAOS staff member Carina van Heerde remarked, "It's truly great day for families. The kids always enjoy themselves but mom and dad also have fun. It's wonderful to see the community come out on such an important weekend." At KAOS 91.1 we couldn't agree more, so please plan to join us in a day of fun, at Dunvegan Gardens on April 17th!





find themselves at the front doors of the Wood Buffalo Food Bank.

There are some who have unexpectedly found themselves in a tough financial position whether it's from unexpected bills or

For others, the food bank is what helps them bridge the gap between pay days.

Then there are some who, for the first time in their life, had to turn to the food bank when returning to Fort McMurray following evacuation and had a real need for help to put food on the table.

No matter the reason, clients are thankful the food bank was there to help them and thankful for people's generosity to keep those shelves stocked.

That generosity is what helps the food bank provide its essential service to the

A big part of that generosity happens thanks to the annual Syncrude Food Drive, a community endeavour that has helped feed this community for 25 years and still counting.

"There were many years where it was touch and go, and the generosity of this community is the only thing that has kept the food bank alive all these years," points out Arianna Johnson, the food bank's current executive director. "Funding through grants is

It's human nature to want to put a 'face' to an issue to help identify with the purpose of a particular social profit, but that is sometimes a misnomer.

"There is no face of hunger," says Johnson, who has been with the food bank for six

"Every year there are many different faces and demographics of those struggling with food security, especially in this region."

Traditionally, food bank users are the working poor, the disabled, the unemployed, single parents and rural residents who don't have access to nutritious food.

"I would say the only addition to that as of recently, are those who lost it all in many of the disasters and emergencies that have happened in the last six years from apartment fires to floods to the wild fire.

"The face of hunger is your neighbour," describes Johnson. "It is your co-worker. It is your client; your family. It could be anyone and for any reason. It could be a two-income household that has a sudden illness that reguires travel for treatment. It could be a family who has had a sudden death that is paying for a funeral. It could be a retiree whose rent is well beyond their pension. There is no one face of hunger. It could happen to any of us.

Johnson's words echo comments of Jeanine Colley, the food bank director in the

In an interview dated about 1993, Colley had said the ratio of new users to repeat users was formerly about two for every 10. At the time of the interview, there were almost as many new clients coming in as repeat users. These new clients lived in what some had considered to be the more affluent areas of Fort McMurray such as Thickwood, Beacon Hill and Dickinsfield.

"Right now, we're seeing areas we never saw before," Colley noted. "(What) people have to understand is that poverty doesn't have a face, it doesn't have a colour ... it's out there. You don't know if it's the neighbour across the street or your daughter's friend."

Colley had made these comments at a time when the food bank was in crisis; a time so dire, it was actually facing closure.

That's because its predecessor started by postal workers in 1986 was forced to end. Jokingly referred to as the Break My Back campaign, the letter carriers would deliver pamphlets to households encouraging them to leave food donations on their doorstep



Colley knew something had to be done, that a new way to collect donations needed to be introduced to keep the shelves full. Taking more direct action to organize community support, she approached Kelly Boyd, the then manager of radio stations CJOK and CKYX, to deal with the crisis. The station already had a record of community involvement having inaugurated its Marathon of Hope.

Their collaboration picked up where Break My Back ended, organizing a food and cash drive with the radio stations doing all the

That first food drive eliminated any concerns Colley had about community support. Reeling from the unprecedented generosity of McMurrayites, she knew it as enough to continue providing service.

The success of the inaugural food drive made it an annual event. It aained further momentum the second year when the CJOK/CKYK Radio Group teamed up with Wilson Industries, a key involvement that has continued with H. Wilson Industries providing the means to collect the donations and transport to the warehouse.

Today, the Syncrude Food Drive is still going strong, but that's not to say it hasn't faced its share of challenges such as falling woefully short of its fundraising goals and being the victim of thefts. It has also enjoyed triumphs such as surpassing fundraising goals in some years and being the recipient of significant individual donations – some anonymous.

One of the most remarkable food drives was in 2016.

With 20,000 people missing from Fort McMurray, the economy crippling families and the region, and the cost of the wildfire, the food bank had readied itself for a decline in donations.



"However, in true Fort McMurray style, when the call went out, the community responded as they have so many times before, and I am sure they will again," said Johnson.

There have been some changes through the years such as at the turn of the century, when the CJOK/CKYK Radio Group introduced a kick-off event. Then in 2005, Syncrude Canada Inc. stepped forward to make the Corporate Challenge a greater success. These changes continue to shape the format of the annual Syncrude Food Drive.

Food bank staff work tirelessly to ensure the success of the food drive alongside valued volunteers who, depending on the weather, have stood outside of grocery stores shivering in frigid temperatures collecting donations.

And it's not always the grown-ups as some of Fort McMurray's younger residents have also lent a hand at collections such as Evan Hamilton and teammates Taylor Bulbuc, 11 and Kennedy Dirk, 12, from the peewee AA minor hockey team in 2009. It was one simple reason they helped: "Our community supports us a lot so we want to support them, too." A similar sentiment had been voiced by John Wilson for his company's involvement: "I feel that it's important to give back to the community that has given me so much."

Even when the community has been hurting, it has responded to calls for help. For example, in the grips of a recession in 2008/09. there was an overwhelming support from residents highlighting Fort McMurray as "an amazing, generous, caring place."

As Fort McMurray was reeling from the devastating Horse River fire. the 2016 food drive kicked off with Syncrude making a record-breaking donation of \$200,000, over double its pledge from the previous year.

"Our region has shown its resiliency in coming together during the wildfire and the continued recovery," said Mark Ward, Syncrude President and CEO, in announcing the donation.

He also praised the volunteers saying "volunteers including more than 150 Syncrude employees and their families collect food and cash donations at grocery stores and other retailers across the region. The food drive helps provide immediate food needs for residents while working towards long-term solutions to hunger and poverty."

Even with the support and growing awareness of hunger issues, Johnson admits that the stigma around food bank use still exists though much less than previously.

"In the last six years, we have increased the visibility of not just the issue of hunger, but of the food bank and educated the community about the reasons why a family may need us and that there is no shame in seeking assistance.

"There is still a ways to go, but it certainly has decreased and especially after the fire when the food bank offered re-entry support services to any and all who needed it without question."

Through the years, the Corporate Challenge and Syncrude Food Drive have become critical components of the relationship between the food bank and all members of the community. This is driven by the growing need for the food bank services and the growing willingness of individuals, unions, corporations, social clubs, schools and churches to make a contribution to its success.

And that all important relationship will ensure the success of the Syncrude Food Drive for another 25 years.

As for her personal take on the holidays, "Fort McMurray is home to me with my mom and sister here. I look forward to the holidays to relax with them," added Goc, who hails from Poland.

Despite an RBC report predicting lower holiday sales for 2017 due to overspending last year at 51% - compared to 41 per cent in 2015 – and the largest majority of over-spenders – that's 63 per cent living in the Prairies - Rob Martin, general manager of the local branch is confident sales will be strong.

"The Fort McMurray store has more Christmas sales than any other Canadian Tire in the country, with over \$1M annually. We are a onestop shop. Ranging from the handy person to the car lover, we have something for everyone on your list. We pride ourselves on having good, better, best of everything, and also for every budget. We are constantly upgrading according to the season, and keep up with the latest trends," notes Martin, who has been in town for six years.

Speaking of trends, home decor, and furniture are relatively new to







the Canadian Tire line-up, which has changed its inventory from just an "outdoors store." Centrepieces, cushions, dishes, stylish furniture, accessories, window treatments, and artificial flowers plus plants are few of the sundry items adding to the décor line-up, complete with holiday

This evolution has come with the changing trends in Canadian shopping habits, and demographics. The store has introduced themes, and "colour of the season," which for the curious, happens to be Alpine White this year. "We have a Canadian exclusive with Disney. This often gives us an exclusive line-up as well. The big ones this December are Star Wars with the new movie out. Toys from the new Cars movie from this summer are huge too, and pretty much on everyone's radar.'

Giving back to the community is also near and dear to Canadian Tire. Throughout the year the store supports as many groups as possible.

"Whether it is providing a table at the front of the store for a group to sell raffle tickets or providing space for a charitable BBQ or an auction item for any giving event, we try and help everyone. Some of those groups include Jumpstart, Boys and Girls Club, Big Brothers Big Sisters,

YMCA, Canadian Mental Health Association of Wood Buffalo, both school boards, Waypoints and many sports associations," Martin notes.

"When it comes to Christmas specifically we support the Keyano Gala, Festival of Trees in support of the Northern Lights Health Foundation and the Salvation Army Kettle program. Many of our staff are involved in the Santa's Anonymous program. Also throughout the year, the staff donates to a Food Bank Fund and during the holidays the business matches all funds raised by staff and donate it the Wood Buffalo Food Bank.

Personally, the holidays are a "reason to get together, and slow down for a day or two," for Martin, who has been in Fort McMurray for six years, and moved from Ontario.

Another Ontarian on the Canadian Tire team is Ray McDonald, the owner of the local store for two years. The 3rd Annual Jeremy Snook Memorial Raffle raised an additional \$115,000 to bring the total raised to \$313,388 over three years and the \$1.5 million Palliative Care Suites project is now fully funded.


Donor funds provided for a Youth Mental Health Navigator position that was filled in 2017. This means our region's vulnerable youth have better access to mental health resources when they need them.

Spicy Gingerbread Cookies

- ½ tspn. baking powder ½ tspn. ground nutmeg
- 1/2 cup sugar
- ½ tspn. baking soda
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 1/2 tspn. ground
- all-purpose flour • 1 tspn. ginger • 1/2 teaspoon salt • 1 tspn. ground cloves

• 2 cups sifted

- 1. In a large bowl, cream together the margarine and sugar until smooth. Stir in molasses and egg yolk. Combine the flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves, ginger, and nutmeg; blend into the molasses mixture until smooth. Cover, and chill for at least one hour.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 350° F (175° C). On a lightly floured surface, roll the dough out to 1/4" thickness. Cut into desired shapes with cookie cutters. Place cookies 2" apart or ungreased cookie sheets
- 3. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes in the preheated oven until firm. Remove from cookie sheets to cool on wire racks. Frost or decorate when cool.



AND THE GOOD OF WOOD BUFFALO

id Mubarak, Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukka. There's no doubt that sometime in the fall or early winter many people ■ have heard one or all of the well-known religious greetings during the regular course of their daily routines. Or have seen ■ these words typed boldly on a Facebook post or a piece of colourful literature. These are common religious phrases used by members of our community, or friends of those religious communities to express greetings, fellowship, or blessing to all who will hear. These are words of hope, love, and goodwill. They are words which bring a sense of connection, of community and words that make people feel "at home".

A quick search of the internet reveals a basic definition of these common religious phrases.

Eid Mubarak or Blessed Eid (Arabic: كارابم ديع) is a traditional Muslim greeting reserved for use on the festivals of Eid al-Adha and Eid al-Fitr. ... However, it is only used during the celebration of the two Muslim holidays. It is a holy time of sacrifice and generosity to friends, family and the needy.

Merry Christmas is a common phrase used by Christians and non-Christians around the annual Christmas season celebrating Christ's birth, held on December 25 in the Western world. It is a holy time of generosity, peace, and goodwill to all

Happy Hanukkah is a traditional Jewish term used at the lesser Jewish Hanukkah festival, which lasts for eight days from the 25th day of Kislev (in December). This festival commemorates the rededication of the Temple in 165 BC.

While these groups all have clearly different deities and worship styles, they do have at least one thing in common, and that's what I wanted to highlight today.

What do these major world religions all have in common? In the Social Cities August report titled Religion and the Good of the City, Milt Friesen, the Program Director at an Ontario think tank called Cardus, indicates that Religious Institutions are impactful parts of what Cardus calls the "Social Architecture" of a city - the complex network of relationships between people, institutions, and culture.

What these groups have in common: they have all led the way in developing better communities in one way or another. Although many groups are less known for their religious advancement they are all very

significant in their impact on the social constructs of communities. Historically religious groups have been the major deliverers of social services, education, and healthcare. Even currently on the local scene, one need not look very far to see the impact of religious organizations on the community of Wood Buffalo.

For example, the Centre of Hope and the Soup Kitchen were created in response of the members of the Fellowship Baptist Church to meet the growing needs of the street population. The Salvation Army has several programs responding to the real needs of everyday citizens and newcomers to the community as well. The Family Christian Centre

responded to the counselling needs of the community with the Legacy Counselling centre. And even The Red Cross was started

> by a religious organization in an expression of worship and to meet the increasing humanitarian globally.

Information received at the time of writing this article indicates there are approximately 93 religious organizations in this community. All have congregants and participants from all walks of life. These groups, who are often unnoticed by the hurried citizen, have been contributing to the region for decades. They meet spiritual needs as well a number of regional social needs too. They have been here a long time; in fact, some of the first institutions to be formally established in this community were religious groups. John Gilpin the author

of Doing what's Right for Kids-1912-2012, A History of Fort McMurray Public Schools said, "When the public school estab-

lished the first school here, there was only one small coffee shop, a bus stop, and a church."

We live in a time where it is often fashionable to treat religious groups as superstitious, socially irrelevant or even fading institutions but I believe Wood Buffalo is an open community where we don't extinguish but celebrate the expression of religious groups and the great work they do to build community.

This year, when greeted with one of those familiar phrases lets purpose to return the greeting, receive the blessing and commit to building a friendlier community we can all call home. Will

own living room.


Surfer's Christmas List By The Surfaris

...or Chanukah. After all, why wouldn't you spell the same holiday two different ways?

t's that time of year again when the rest of the world gets ready to celebrate Christmas on December 25, and Jews are scrambling to the Jewish calendar to find out where Hanukkah (or Chanukah) falls this year. Yes, we have a different calendar. Also, it's year 5778, not 2017 (but hey who's counting).

This year the Festival of Lights (Hanukkah or Chanukah) will be celebrated from Tuesday, December 12 through Wednesday, December 20. In its most basic terms, it's Jewish Christmas, but not like Christmas at all, other than receiving gifts.

There's no Santa, although Saturday Night Live did create the Hanukkah Harry character to fill a large void in the upbringing of every North American Jewish child's life. That part was played by my uncle for one year only when I was in my early teens.

He rode his cart (not a sleigh) pulled by his three trusty mules (not reindeer) named Moishe, Herschel, and Schlomo. He hobbled into the house (he has bad knees of course, he always complains about them) with all the gifts for all the children in a burlap sack, not a fancy red velvet bag. No fancy bells that jingle and jive either; Hanukkah Harry had a kazoo and cowbell. That was a wacky and memorable year. Of course, he only shows up for one of the eight nights; eight would be quite the commitment.

The story of Chanukkah begins when Alexander the Great's rule over Syria, Egypt and Palestine came to an end, when he was succeeded by Antiochus IV. Alexander allowed those living in the lands under his control to continue observing their own religions, that came to an end when Antiochus took over.

He began to oppress the Jews severely, placing Greek priests in the Jewish Temple, and massacring Jews, forbidding the practicing of the religion and desecrating the Temple by sacrificing pigs (a non-kosher animal) on the altar.

A small group of Jewish warriors led by Judah Maccabee, although their numbers were smaller than the Greek opposition they managed to defeat their enemies. In the battle the Temple was nearly ruined. Every Temple has a six-armed menorah that is supposed to burn through the night every night, in those days they used pure olive oil as fuel.

When rebuilding the Temple, the Jews found that there was only

enough oil to light the menorah for one day, yet it burned for eight, and that's the miracle of Chanukah and why we celebrate by lighting an eight-armed menorah!

To celebrate the family will get together around the menorah with eight-arms and one extra candle in the middle called the shamus (the candle you use to light all the others), say a prayer and light the candles. On the first night one candle is placed on the far right, the second night the first two candles from the right are lit, and it continues that way for all eight days.

The exchange of gifts isn't a traditional part of Chanukah, but was added later to deal with the jealousy of Jews towards the wicked awesome gift giving holiday that is Christmas (seriously Christmas is awesome), that's the truth!

There's only one traditional food to eat at Chanukkah, that's potato latkes or potato pancakes, it's best served with applesauce or sour cream.

We also play dreidel, a gambling game played using a spinning top with four sides. Most families bet with pennies, because why let a good stereotype go to waste?
