### LOCATION AND SCHEDULE OF THE TOURNAMENT

The tournament will be held at Memorial University of Newfoundland at the St. John's Campus. The playing area will be the Gushue Hall Dining Room which is part of Paton College. The tournament will run from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Sunday, May 20 & 8:45 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday, May 21, 2018. The tournament site is a 2 min walk from the Paton College residences.

### AIRPORT ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

We will arrange a shuttle to pick-up and drop-off for each visiting province, getting to and from the tournament. This will be available from noon on Thursday, May 17 to noon on Tuesday, May 22. The airport is just 15 minutes from the campus by car/taxi.

### ACCOMMODATIONS

### Memorial University Residence – Paton College

The residence for the event will be Paton College which is close to Prince Phillip Drive (the main road that runs through the St. John's campus). Paton College consists of a number of residence buildings and includes Gushue Hall and Hatcher House. The playing area will be the Gushue Hall Dining Hall. The Saturday evening banquet will also be in the Dining Hall in Gushue Hall. All other meals will be served in Hatcher House. 



After entries close, any swimmer that no-shows for their Time Trials event will incur a \$50.00 penalty. Penalties must be paid before the swimmer competes in any other events.

### **Proof of Times**

Individual Events: All entries will be proven via the on-line entry system. Any non-validated times in your meet entry submission report must be proven by the meet entry deadline. The Meet Entry Coordinator may challenge any entry time before or during the competition.

## Doping Control Procedure

Swimmers are notified by a Doping Control Chaperone and are required to sign a notification form. A Doping Control Chaperone will accompany the swimmer until released by the Doping Control Officer (DCO). Upon notification of testing and if necessary, the athlete may notify the DCO if they are competing in another event in the same session. In such cases, the DCO may direct that testing be carried out later in the session, provided a Chaperone accompanies and/or observes the Athlete at all times and until such time as the Athlete reports back to the Doping Control Station for testing.

Photo identification is required for doping control. Coaches are asked to instruct athletes to bring photo identification to competitions (i.e. driver's license, school identification, passport, etc.)

## **Doping Control Information**

Athletes are encouraged to take the following steps:

# **Production types permitted in the Festival:**

All productions should be one act plays, limited to 65 minutes or less. In order for a piece to come to the festival, it needs to meet the 65 minute requirement, timed from first cue. This allows us to give opportunity for more shows and more students to come to the festival. Productions exceeding the time limit will be ineligible for awards. Productions will find this out during their adjudication period and it will be announced at the awards ceremony as such: "At this point, this school did not meet the time limit as set out by the Provincial festival".

BOH manager and Festival Stage Manager reports each One Act play run time, on headset. Shows will be videographed from the tech booth, as backup evidence of run times.

One act plays can be musicals, dramas, comedies, student written work, published and non-published work, collective creations, etc., as long as a script is provided to the adjudicator by the submission date (information provided upon registration).

# Students involved: AHSDFA performers/ technicians must be registered in high school. This may be grades 9-12, depending on the high school. Non-high school students may perform if prior permission is granted by the Provincial president, but only in exceptional cases.

# *Shows must come in their entirety, or source alternatives in advance.

# **2018 Championships Qualification and Info Sheet**

### The Qualifying period for Championships is August 1st, 2017 through July 31st 2018

### **Elite Level Qualifications**

- 1. At least 100 points must have been earned in the current qualifying year from the Regular Agility class at the Open or Elite level.
- 2. At least 40 points must have been earned in the current qualifying year, at the Open or Elite level, in each of the Jumpers and Chances classes.
- 3. If a dog is 9 or older on the first day of Championships they MUST enter the Veterans division. If a dog is 10 or older on the first day of the Championships, then they MUST enter into the Double Digit division.
- 4. Dogs MAY enter the Veterans division at age 7 if they wish.

### What To Expect in the Elite Divisions:

- Longer courses. The average length of courses will be in the 22-24 obstacle range, with some rounds going up to 28 obstacles.
- Consistently challenging design. While all NADAC courses have some element of difficulty, some may be easier (for certain dogs and handlers) than others. At Championships, the courses will all lean more towards the more difficult.
- Full set of obstacle challenges in each round. While some rounds do have a theme, such as the Jumpers round or Touch n Go round, each and every round will generally have the full set of equipment tests on course.
- Distance tests. These tests are NOT bonus lines. But they will typically be a sequence of 2-5 obstacles where you are required to stay behind the line, similar to Chances. This line will be anywhere between 10-20 feet away from the farthest obstacle in the test.
- If the handler successfully completes the distance challenge, they will be awarded 10 bonus points

### **Pre-Elite Qualifications**

 At least 100 points must have been earned in the current qualifying year from the Regular Agility class in Intro, Novice, Open or Elite, with the exception that a dog entered in Pre-Elite cannot have earned more than 100 points in Elite Regular in their lifetime up to September 15, 2018. If a dog earns more than 100 points in Elite Regular, then their entry will be switched to the Elite level.

### What to expect in the Pre-Elite Divisions:

- Courses similar to an Elite level challenge. Dogs should be comfortable doing a full set of 12 weave poles, multiple contacts and challenges comparable to an Elite level course on a normal weekend. In the themed runs, such as the Jumpers round or the Touch n Go round, there may be more repetitions of certain obstacles than on a regular weekend, though never more than 12 poles at one time.
- Shorter courses than the Elite Division. The Pre-Elite course typically has changes from the Elite course. These changes can be either a reduced number of obstacles, or reduced challenge, or both. There will be no distance test at the Pre-Elite level.
- Larger groupings. Because Pre-Elite is not the main event we do not split up the groups like we do for the Elite division. There are only 4 divisions: Large, Medium, Small and Mini. The only other added division may be if we have enough Junior Handlers in Pre-Elite to make a group. Pre-Elite should be viewed as an opportunity for dogs that aren't quite ready for the main event to still get a chance to experience the environment and camaraderie of the event.
- Pre-Elite ribbons and overall awards are smaller than the Elite Divisions (but still pretty darned nice!).

### Scoring for both Elite and Pre-Elite:

Scoring is done on a time plus faults system. Each round will have a base number of points that everyone starts with. For this example we will use 150 as our base number. When your dog runs their time and any faults incurred will be subtracted from this number. So a dog that ran in 25.00 seconds with 10 course faults would have a score of 115.00. This score is what determines your placement in your division.

- The base number changes depending on the length of the course and the challenges involved. A more challenging course that takes a longer time to run gets a higher base number, while a simpler course that runs very quickly gets a lower base number.
- If the Pre-Elite course is shorter than Elite, they will start with a lower base number to reflect the shorter course
- **Only** the top 33% of each division goes to the finals round, based on the cumulative scores of the first 7 rounds.
- The winner of each division is whomever has the highest score over all 8 rounds combined.

### PROCEDURES

# **Registration & Events**

All events are Open, meaning anyone may compete from any geographic area. 'Bye' positions are Awarded to the 1st Place finishers in each Category from the Region into the FireFit Championship Finals. A precise definition can be found on each Events Information Page Link located on the current years Schedule.

Teams are urged to sign up early as in many cases Events fill to capacity and the Registration has to be closed. All members on a team must be from the same department. Registration will be through our On-Line Registration System (via the FireFit web site). Teams should be registered a minimum of four (4) weeks prior to event in order to avoid late registration fees.

A team or individual is considered to be registered upon completion of the On-Line Registration including payment. Payment may be made by Visa, or Master Card On-Line Purchase Order is also accepted but please ensure you have your Department or Cities Purchase Order # before starting the On-Line Registration.

When registering On-Line the system automatically creates an Invoice which should be printed for Departmental / Union / Sponsor reimbursement.

Acknowledgement of your registration will be sent via Email and can be viewed On-Line from the Event Page by clicking on the Who's Coming Link. The 'Who's Coming' Page is a great tool for those using PO's as you will be able to see if we have received your payment.

Refund requests, in the form of a credit, will be honored 14 days prior to competition; thereafter no refund.

The Waiver and Release form must be signed by every competitor prior to participation. The form stipulates that this is a "drug free" competition; by signing the form competitors acknowledge they are not using any performance enhancing or illegal drugs. You will receive & complete the waiver the evening prior to the event. In order to practice on the course this form must be completed. In some cases it is necessary to pick-up passes to get onto Fair & Festival Grounds where the Event is being held so it is important to make arrangements for someone to be at the Registration Confirmation.

FireFit will prepare confirmation documentation which must be verified by a team member at the Registration Confirmation held at the event site the night before each competition. Changes can be made at this time so that the Start List can be prepared for the following morning.

The start order is created by FireFit and will be posted the morning of the Event. We do our best to match those competitors who have never raced before against each other. Competitors with times will be matched against those with similar times. The Fastest competitors will run at the end of the day.

# Things you Need to Know

All competitors should check the Event Information Page, for which they will be attending, to confirm what time they should be on site on the day of Competition. They should also check the 'Who's Coming' link on this page to ensure they are registered in the correct Events and Categories.

Substitutions due to injury, transfers, illness, shift changes are permitted. Team Members must stay OFF the course when they are not competing.

Competitor Packages are picked up from the Registration Area in most cases at the time of Registration Confirmation. Competitor Packages include an Event T-Shirt for each team member. Team members who do not compete do not receive T-Shirts. Items not claimed on the day of competition can NOT be sent to competitors, but arrangements may be made to pick them up at future events.

## PROCEDURES

# **Registration & Events**

All events are Open, meaning anyone may compete from any geographic area. 'Bye' positions are Awarded to the 1st Place finishers in each Category from the Region into the FireFit Championship Finals. A precise definition can be found on each Events Information Page Link located on the current years Schedule.

Teams are urged to sign up early as in many cases Events fill to capacity and the Registration has to be closed. All members on a team must be from the same department. Registration will be through our On-Line Registration System (via the FireFit web site). Teams should be registered a minimum of four (4) weeks prior to event in order to avoid late registration fees.

A team or individual is considered to be registered upon completion of the On-Line Registration including payment. Payment may be made by Visa, or Master Card On-Line Purchase Order is also accepted but please ensure you have your Department or Cities Purchase Order # before starting the On-Line Registration.

When registering On-Line the system automatically creates an Invoice which should be printed for Departmental / Union / Sponsor reimbursement.

Acknowledgement of your registration will be sent via Email and can be viewed On-Line from the Event Page by clicking on the Who's Coming Link. The 'Who's Coming' Page is a great tool for those using PO's as you will be able to see if we have received your payment.

Refund requests, in the form of a credit, will be honored 14 days prior to competition; thereafter no refund.

The Waiver and Release form must be signed by every competitor prior to participation. The form stipulates that this is a "drug free" competition; by signing the form competitors acknowledge they are not using any performance enhancing or illegal drugs. You will receive & complete the waiver the evening prior to the event. In order to practice on the course this form must be completed. In some cases it is necessary to pick-up passes to get onto Fair & Festival Grounds where the Event is being held so it is important to make arrangements for someone to be at the Registration Confirmation.

FireFit will prepare confirmation documentation which must be verified by a team member at the Registration Confirmation held at the event site the night before each competition. Changes can be made at this time so that the Start List can be prepared for the following morning.

The start order is created by FireFit and will be posted the morning of the Event. We do our best to match those competitors who have never raced before against each other. Competitors with times will be matched against those with similar times. The Fastest competitors will run at the end of the day.

# Things you Need to Know

All competitors should check the Event Information Page, for which they will be attending, to confirm what time they should be on site on the day of Competition. They should also check the 'Who's Coming' link on this page to ensure they are registered in the correct Events and Categories.

Substitutions due to injury, transfers, illness, shift changes are permitted. Please inform FireFit as soon as you know that there is a change to your Registered Competitors so that the update can be made prior to Registration Confirmation the evening before the event. Substitution within a team that has qualified for the FireFit Finals are allowed, provided that at least 3 of the original members are still on the team and the substitute is from the same department.

Each competitor will be assigned a number which will match their Start Order # and will be attached to the Scott AirPak that they will use.

Team times are calculated by taking the three fastest competitors times on the team and adding them together. This becomes their Team Time.

All equipment worn must be NFPA approved structural firefighting equipment, this includes boots, gloves, helmet, turnout pants & jacket. Liners must remain in your bunker gear. Competitors found not using NFPA approved gear will be disqualified. Hoods and shields are not required.

Team Members must stay OFF the course when they are not competing.

Concerns regarding penalties will be resolved with the Course Marshal and the Referee's. Awards Competitor Packages are picked up from the Registration Area in most cases at the time of Registration Confirmation. Competitor Packages include an Event T-Shirt for each team member. Team members who do not compete do not receive T-Shirts. Items not claimed on the day of competition can NOT be sent to competitors, but arrangements may be made to pick them up at future events.

Pins will be awarded to competitors with the following times: Bronze: Under 4 minutes, Silver: Under 3 minutes, Gold: Under 2 minutes 30 seconds, Sub 2 Pin: Under 2 minutes Sub 1:40 : Under 1 minute 40 Seconds & Under 1:30 : Sub 1 minute 30 Seconds. Pins are distributed during and after the Awards Ceremony.

The top 3 teams will receive wall plaques, and FireFit Medallions. The top 3 finishers in each individual category will receive FireFit Medallions.

Other prizes may be awarded by Sponsors on an event by event basis. FireFit can assumes no responsibility for the delivery of these awards.

# Yearly Finals 'The FireFit Championship Finals!'

Men's Teams who have competed with a team time of 9 minutes or less and Women's Teams with 12 minutes or less team time qualify to compete on 2 of the 3 days designated as Wild Card Days at the FireFit Championship Finals. Wild Card Teams are competing for the 14 to 16 Wild Card spots on Final Day. Teams who have placed 1st in their designated Regional will receive an automatic Bye onto Final Day. Competitors from each Individual Category will qualify onto Final Day by placing first in their Category within their Region.

Individuals not on Qualifying Teams, who have competed at a Regional Event, can qualify to compete on upto 2 of the 3 'Wild Card Days' for a position on Final Day be meeting the following criteria:



Moving forward with the intent to focus entirely on competitions, it became necessary to improve the training standards and seek specialized instruction for technique and choreography. Unfortunately, we do not have access to this level of instruction in Fort McMurray and it would be cost prohibitive to send our dancers away for this training. Therefore, the Festival Team Dance Association acquired the support of Team Canada Technical Director and Instructor, Paul Otterbein, to travel to Fort McMurray throughout this past season to train our dancers on a monthly basis. Although this was cheaper than sending our dancers away, the costs associated still created a burden on the organization. However, receiving this level of training has allowed our dancers to step up to a much higher level of competition and will lead toward the potential of meeting higher qualifying standards associated with regional, national and international competition. Without this stepping stone, the dancers would have plateaued and not have the chance to realize those possibilities. Adding this piece to their training was a huge success this season and is something that will become more permanent as we plan now for next season.

Therefore, the Festival Team Dance Association acquired the support of Team Canada Technical Director and Instructor, Paul Otterbein, to travel to Fort McMurray throughout this past season to train our dancers on a monthly basis. Although this was cheaper than sending our dancers away, the costs associated still created a burden on the organization. However, receiving this level of training has allowed our dancers to step up to a much higher level of competition and will lead toward the potential of meeting higher qualifying standards associated with regional, national and international competition. Without this stepping stone, the dancers would have plateaued and not have the chance to realize those possibilities. Adding this piece to their training was a huge success this season and is something that will become more permanent as we plan now for next season.

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

They were Provincial Futsal Champions in 2014, placed fourth at the 2016-17 Indoor Tier 2 Provincial Championships and were the Silver medalists at the 2017 Outdoor Tier 2 Provincial Championships. This is a great accomplishment for our team given that they must compete with the top teams from Edmonton and Calgary.

Travel to these two tournaments overseas would allow the boys to build on the success they have already had. They will experience setting and working towards a longer term goal, which helps them develop overall life skills. The fundraising that is required allows them to participate positively in our community; they are involved in bottle drives, fundraising sales, and bagging groceries at local grocery stores. This also allows our community to see youth in a positive light.

The players involved in the U15 International are developing excellent leadership skills through advancing their competitiveness. They are also encourage to participate in sport for life. Dear Chairperson, Community Investment Program:

It's my pleasure to support the application for the Fort McMurray Youth Soccer U15 Boys 2018 International Team for a Legacy Sports Grant. It's been a pleasure watching this group of players develop in a strong competitive team on the pitch and great ambassadors for Fort McMurray off the pitch in the past five years.

This group effectively changed with the appointment of Jay Mutala as head coach in 2013. A technically excellent coach who had trained with professional teams in his native Zambia as teenager, Jay instilled professionalism in a group that had struggled on the field. In addition to working on improving technique, fitness and tactical awareness, there was a real focus on courtesy and sportsmanship. Players were expected to greet coaches and each other with handshakes at the start and end of every training session. I was personally shocked when I went to observe a session and all the kids came over to shake my hand without being prompted.

There was also expectations when the team travelled to play in tournaments and provincial championships out of town. Players had to participate in fundraisers, whether it was bagging groceries in supermarkets, collecting and sorting bottles at drives or cooking and selling hamburgers outside stores. These sorts of activities, which are also ongoing to raise funds for this trip to Europe, build character and connect young people to the costs of activities. Several of the players have now started coaching in our grassroots program for players ages three to six as well as taken their refereeing courses. This group will produce many future volunteers for soccer and the wider community.

I also had an opportunity to coach these players during the summer of 2016, when the Horse River Wildfire forced the evacuation of the community for much of the outdoor season. Jay decided to return to Zambia to visit so I stepped in while we played in the Edmonton Minor Soccer Association's u-14 Premier League. Both the players and the parents were excellent ambassadors for the community. They demonstrated a great deal of maturity in answering questions time after time about their individual circumstances surrounding their displacement. This is not something you'd expect from a group of 12-year-old boys and they were outstanding representatives for Fort McMurray.

On returning to the community, the parents and players undertook the very sizable task of hosting the 2017 Alberta Soccer Association u14 T-II provincial championships. This was no easy task as we didn't have a girls team entered in the tournament so this group had double the workload in terms of finding sponsors to fund the event and staffing critical volunteer positions to ensure the tournament ran smoothly. Their efforts were commended by the Alberta Soccer Association, who gave us the highest possible ranking as a host. We also received plenty of praise from the parents and players of the 13 other boys and girls teams who travelled to Fort McMurray. A lot of myths about our community were dispelled and they appreciated the hospitality organized by this group. On the field, the boys lost 2-1 in the gold-medal final but were praised for the skill on the field. The tournament's referee-in-chief specifically spoke to me afterwards to praise the behaviour and decorum of the team's parents and fans in conducting themselves in an exemplary fashion.

This is not the most talented group of players I've seen in my 14 years of involvement with the Fort McMurray Youth Soccer Association or the 40-plus years I've spent playing, coaching and watching the sport. This group, though, exemplify the best qualities you want young people to take from sport. They are committed to excellent on and off the field through hard work, discipline and doing things the right way. I hope you feel the same way. I am a coach at the Ptarmigan Nordic Ski Club with the Jackrabbit 3 group, as well I train with the upcoming race team and Track Attack groups. I am a level 1 NCCP certified coach and I hope to further my coaching development in the years to come.

I want to inspire younger skiers in the club, and I want to see more people from Fort McMurray compete in a higher level of sport. I am inspired by Graeme Killick, he skied the same trails I do, he wore the same club name I do and he's from Fort McMurray. If one person can do it many more can. I hope to inspire the kids that they can do it. Being a coach at the PNSC, I use the training camps I attend as a way to learn from other coaches, I then take the techniques and drills that I learn and I use the same principles when I coach the younger skier at the PNSC. It gives them the same information and techniques that other skiers their age are reciving.

I would benfit from the training because they are at elevation and Canmore has training opportunity's that Fort McMurray just dosen't offer, such as places to roller ski, long mountian runs and a opportunity to ski on the Haig Glacier in the summer. It would also be a opportunity for me to train with my coach and teammates, living in Fort McMurray I don't get to train with them on a day-to-day basis.
