The WBTT Club plays once a week during the season from Sep - Apr from 7-9PM at Holy Trinity Highschool. We currently have 8 tables, some of them are in poor condition and will need to be replaced soon. A proper club table typically costs over \$2000. With additional funding we can replace some tables and aquire a training robot that automatically feeds a player balls. This is a very helpful aid in training juniors and new players as well as letting experienced players practice their strokes. We also host multiple tournaments a year and could use the funds for prizes. This could be another incentive for new players to join the club.
