




Snye Point Outdoor Event Space

Emerging Themes from Engagement

Vision:

- Snye Point Outdoor Event Space as a Meeting Place
- Keep what works, Improve what doesn't

Amenities:

- Accessible washrooms
- Utilities Electrical access, water, Wi-Fi, maybe lighting

- Garbage/recycling area/bins
- More seating
- Commemoration, Heritage & Culture
- Gazebo or covered area
- Public art
- Pathways
- Fire pit

Emerging Themes from Engagement

Site Concerns & Desired Characteristics:

- Alignments with sunrise/cardinal directions
- Keep green feel/connection to earth
- Open & flexible
- Concerns about wear/tear on turf
 - o Paved event site or heavy-duty turf
 - o Performance pad able to support 70,000lb
- Space to accommodate for SL-260 stage (or smaller)

- Flood concerns
- Improve drainage/grading bottom of hill
- Improve accessibility & pathways
- Concerns with parking on Point
- Access to "Beach"/Connection to water
- Perimeter driveable trail for emergency/event access
- Gates: Areas that can be gated during ticketed events or events with alcohol
