multiple sclerosis (M.S.) is a chronic, often disabling, neurological disease WHEREAS affecting 100,000 Canadians; and Canada having the highest rate of multiple sclerosis in the world; and WHEREAS multiple sclerosis symptoms vary widely and may lead to problems with WHEREAS numbness, coordination, vision, and speech, as well as extreme fatigue and paralysis; and there is no known cause of, or cure for, multiple sclerosis; and WHEREAS approximately one in every 400 Canadians lives with M.S. and, on average, 12 WHEREAS Canadians are diagnosed with MS every day; and the Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada, founded in 1948, is the only national WHEREAS voluntary organization in Canada that supports both M.S. research and services for people with M.S. and their families.
